



## <u>Curwen's Management Team</u>


Each year group has a Year Group Leader. For Year 2 this is Mrs Richards.

## Arriving at School

We are having soft openings and closings to minimise the number of people in the playground.

The gates will be open at 8.40 am and close at 9.00 am everyday, any children who are late should wait with a parent/carer outside the main office until your child/ren can be escorted to their class.


If you want to come to Breakfast Club it is from 7.45 – 8.30am everyday and costs 70p. (Children will not be admitted after 8.30am). Entrance to breakfast club is via the main office.





## Collecting your child

- You can collect your children from their classroom from **3:00pm**.
- The playground gates will be closed at **3:20pm**.
- Again, you may be asked to queue whilst we limit the number of people in the playground.
- If your child is collected after 3:30pm you maybe charged a late fee.


### After school childcare provision

After school we have a 6 o'clock club. This runs Monday to Friday and is open to anyone.

The cost is £9 per day and children are supervised by members of school staff.

This club is flexible-some children stay all week but others only stay on certain days but this must be booked in advance.

Please speak to a member of the office staff if you would like more information about 6 o'clock club.



## <u>Clubs- extra curricular activities</u>

Usually we offer lots of FREE after school clubs for your children which run from 3:15 to 4:30.

We encourage all the children to try and attend <u>at least</u> one club a week.

Due to the current situation, after school clubs will not be running until further notice. We will inform you when this changes.






## Uniform & Clothing

  - Parents/carers are not permitted in the building to look for lost items








### ALL payments should be made online through 'School Money' (including uniform)

- This is important now more than ever as the shared water fountains are currently all out of use






- As much as possible, medical and dental appointments should be arranged outside of the school day.






## **Medical Conditions**



### Topic 1





Our children continue to progress through the RML phonics programme at the beginning of Year 2. This teaches them how to 'sound out' words in order to be able to read and write them.

Later in the year, children will progress on to the Language and Literacy scheme, where they continue to develop their understanding of the English language and apply their knowledge.

Maths



At Curwen, children are taught using principles from the 'MMS' (Maths Makes Sense) scheme. There is a huge focus on being able to work out calculations using column method.

Online parent workshops for both RML and MMS will be run later in the year online- we will inform you of when these will be.

# Forest Schools

Forest Sch

### What is Forest School?

- It involves child-led sessions in a woodland or natural environment, primarily using natural resources.
- It aims to promote resilient, confident, independent and creative learners.
- Where will Forest School take place?
- Forest School sessions will take place in West Ham Park.
- The school grounds are also being developed to support more outdoor nature activities.
- What will my child do at Forest School?
- -Children carry out a range of outdoor activities that develop their skills and knowledge relating to the National Curriculum.
- -Some activities may include: mini beast hunts; plant and animal identification; observation of seasonal changes; land art; tree-climbing; digging; whittling; sawing, den building, fire lighting and outdoor cooking.

### What clothing will my child need to attend Forest School?

-For health and safety reasons, children need to wear weatherappropriate, full length clothing and walking boots or wellies. -Due to COVID-19 we would like children to wear their own waterproofs and wellies where possible.



















## RSE (Relationship & Sex Education)


Relationship and Health education is mandatory for all primary schools to teach from spring 2020. It will be delivered through the school's PSHE (personal, social, health and economic education) curriculum.

- Children will be assessed on their knowledge of phonic sounds later this term (postponed Year 1 assessment)





# Home learning



### Top Tips for the Reading Helper

- Try to make reading time fun wherever possible. Aim to do little and often, but not when the reader is tired.
- Make sure that you are using reading material with the right level of difficulty for the reader. Also, check that the content is suitable.
- Blending encourage the reader to break words down into a series of sounds, e.g. c-r-a-sh. Run your finger under each sound in turn to encourage the reader to blend the sounds together.
- Identify some key letter groups in the story and ask the reader to look out for them. Use the child's reading log to record the new letters / letter groups you are focussing on in each session.
- Encourage the reader to look at any pictures in the reading book to get an idea of what it is about. Discuss the pictures with the reader.
- Make a note in the reading log of any tricky or hard words
  particularly high frequency words.
- Help the reader to "work out" words which can't be blended by looking at the other words in the sentence or at the pictures in the book.
- Talk about the book as much as possible:
  - Ask the reader to explain what happened or what may happen.
  - · Ask questions about the story.
- Occasionally read the book or some pages aloud before you ask the reader to read. This will help with understanding and it will give the reader a chance to hear the sounds before reading them. It will also demonstrate what fluent reading sounds like.
- Draw attention to punctuation marks and help the reader to read with feeling, e.g. "HOORAY!" they shouted.
- Play games with the reader. For example, you could:
- Ask her/him to find a word on the page that rhymes with fish.
  Try making up nonsense words for the reader to blend, e.a. twoch.
- 12 Use flash cards to practise high frequency words or letters / letter groups and their sounds.







No one knows how the current Covid-19 situation will continue to affect the education of our children, more lockdowns are expected, knowing that all our children have access to a connected device at home means we can continue to deliver education via home and remote learning if and when required.

#### THE EQUIPMENT ON OFFER

We have selected the Asus C204 MA Chromebook which is best suited to enhance the learning experience of our students at Curwen Primary. This Chromebook is specifically designed for student use with a rugged outer casing. Each Chromebook is also supplied with a 3 year extended warranty and 3 year protection for accidental damage and theft with 60 excess giving complete peace of mind.

#### WHY CHROMEBOOKS?

Chromebooks are extremely secure, easy to use and facilitate both independent study and online collaboration. Through the use of Google Apps for Education. We can further improve student engagement, and open the door to learning.

The Chromebooks will come with the Chromebook licence, please note access to the Curwen Google classroom from the home, will require access to the internet. Internet access at the home is the responsibility of the Parent/Guardian.

The portal will remain open until the 11<sup>th</sup> October 2020. In early October any parent who hasn't signed up to the scheme will receive a phone call as a reminder. Due to the Global pandemic there are delays in all computing devices. Our partners are working closley with manufacturers to minimise delays. We will advise on delivery of the devices closer to the time. Please note the 3year warranty will not start until the devices are delivered.



- Click X if something makes them feel upset, worried or scared









## What is Place2Be?

Place2Be aims to promote children's mental health and learning by offering a range of services to support individuals and their families.

## Parental Consent for Place2Talk


