This is done through building effective partnerships with parents, carers, children and teachers enabling us to give the children the best possible start to their school life. CPS




Your child's school day...

Coming into Nursery... When bringing your child into nursery we encourage you to complete the self registration.




The child has their name and photo, it encourages them to recognise their name and answer the question displayed.

Picking up your child

Introduce any other adult(s) to the class teacher before sending them to pick up your child.

If there is an emergency please phone and let the office know who will be picking up your child. When picking your child up, please wait at the bottom of the steps.





Nappies



Please encourage your children to use the toilet independently. We need to work together to achieve this.

We ask for the children NOT to wear nappies to Nursery.

Children must wear underwear at all times.

If you need advice or support please ask.



Buggies



If you child does not have a medical condition they should not be using a buggy.

It is important for the child's physical development to walk.

Water bottles

Make sure your child's water bottle is labelled with their name.

We encourage the children to drink throughout the session, but please help us to ensure you child recognises their own water bottle.





Food

- There is no food allowed in nursery
- Do NOT put extra food or drinks inside the children's bag
- -There is a snack table for the children to access independently for milk and fruit
- -This is due to allergies within nursery



Clothing and footwear

- Appropriate clothing for the children to play and move around in
- Correct size clothing and footwear. NOT slippers or open toe sandals
- Please ensure shoes fit correctly
- Weather appropriate clothing e.g layers

-Please ensure your child's name is on EVERYTHING!

Library


Nursery will visit the Library once a week on Tuesday. This book is your child's choice.

This in an opportunity for you to discuss with your child what they have learnt about that week.







This term we are going on some educational visits to support our learning. These will include:


West Ham Park

Where possible, we are always pleased when Parents/Carers volunteer to come along and help with supervising groups, so please speak to the class teacher.




What will these educational visits (trips) cost?


ALL payments should be made through the school office.


Studybugs for Parents and Carers

...and get useful school info straight to your phone! If your child is reported absent and we have not heard from you our attendance officer will be conducting home visits






Keeping in touch...

Medical Conditions

Please ensure that all medical details are up to date - if anything changes, please let us know immediately by speaking to Mrs Welch and Ms Britton.

All children with asthma should have an asthma pump permanently in class (check expiry date regularly). If they no longer require an asthma pump, please put this in writing with a letter from the doctors.

Throughout the year we will be contacting parents to up-date care plans. This is a legal requirement to ensure pupils are safe in school.

What is Place2Be?

Place2Be aims to promote children's mental health and learning by offering a range of services to support individuals and their families.

Place2Talk: a lunchtime drop-in service for all children from Y1 to Y6.

Place2Be One-to-One Counselling: Children are referred for a number of reasons and with parental consent attend weekly counselling sessions for up to a year.

Parent Counselling:

We have a free and confidential adult counselling service available to parents on a Friday afternoon.

Curwen Primary Schools Parent and Toddler Group


Parents and Carers where children from the age of 6 months to 4 years meet and socialise in an informal and safe environment.
