### Your child's nursery session-arriving at Nursery

Gates to the playground will be open at 8:35am but there will be no staff in the playground until 8:45am, so you will need to supervise your children. Children are not permitted to use the playground equipment/climbing frames at this time.

AM: 08:45-09:15- Gates will be locked

Home time: 11:45

The Nursery gate will be opened at 12:15pm.

PM: 12:15-12:45- Gates will be locked

Home time: 3:15

If you are late arriving at Nursery we will be unable to let you in.

### Collecting your child - slight change

You must collect your children from Nursery at 11:45am/3:15pm. Gates will be open from 11:40am/3:10pm for you to wait in the playground but children won't be dismissed until 11:45am/3:15pm.

The playground gates will be closed at 11:55am/3:25pm.

After this time, you are late and you will need to collect from the office.

If your child is collected after 12pm/3:30pm you may be charged a late fee.

PLEASE PHONE THE OFFICE AS SOON AS YOU KNOW YOU ARE GOING TO BE LATE COLLECTING YOUR CHILD TO AVOID BEING CHARGED.





### Collecting your child - safety at the classroom door

Please be patient with teachers and staff whilst we get to know your faces at the end of the day.

We want to make sure that the children are sent home safely, so please be patient. The teacher may be speaking to a parent, so it may take a minute or 2 to dismiss your child.



Please stand back from the steps to give children space to come out of Nursery.

Coming into Nursery...

### Clothing in Nursery



- Name in every item of clothing
- Small, stud earrings only no jewellery
- Appropriate clothing for the children to play and move around in
- Correct size clothing and footwear
- Please ensure shoes fit correctly
- Children must wear underwear
- Weather appropriate clothing
- e.g. layers

Please ensure your child's name is on EVERYTHING!







#### Water bottles

Make sure your child's water bottle is labelled with their name.


We encourage the children to drink throughout the session, but please help us to ensure you child recognises their own water bottle.

#### Snack table

Milk and fruit is offered in each session.







Please encourage your children to use the toilet independently. We need to work together to achieve this.

We ask for the children NOT to wear nappies/pull ups to Nursery.

Children must wear underwear at all times.

If you need advice or support please ask.









If your child does not have a medical condition they should not be using a buggy/stroller/pushchairs/pram to come to Nursery.

It is important for the child's physical and mental development to walk.

Class teachers have been instructed not to take cash or cheques. The only exception to this is charity donations.



If your child is reported absent and we have not heard from you our attendance officer will be conducting home visits

### Celebration/birthday treats

We request that parents do not send in party bags, sweets or treats for their child's birthday as this becomes very difficult for us to manage in school.

To celebrate children's birthdays, we invite them to wear non-uniform when it is their birthday. That way staff know it is their birthday and we can make it a special day for them. If their birthday falls on a Saturday, Sunday or in the holidays then they can choose whether to celebrate the Friday before or Monday after.















- All medical and dental appointments should be arranged outside of the school day.
- Where this is not possible, please inform us through Studybugs and provide evidence of the appointment.
- If your child is at an appointment in the morning, if you can not get them back to school before 12pm, then they should not come back until 1pm.
- No children will be admitted during the lunch hour 12-1pm.





Please ensure that all medical details are up-to-date - if anything changes, please let us know immediately by speaking to the office.

All children with asthma should have an asthma pump permanently in class (make a note expiry date so you know when to contact your GP). If they require any other prescribed medication, then please bring this to the office ONLY.

### DO NOT GIVE ANY MEDICATION OR ASTHMA PUMPS TO CLASS TEACHERS OR SEND IT IN YOUR CHILD'S BAG

Throughout the year we will be contacting parents to update care plans. This is a legal requirement to ensure pupils are safe in school.







### Medical Conditions

If your child hurts themselves outside of school and it is necessary for them to wear a cast/bandage or have crutches etc, then you must inform us as soon as possible and accompany your child to the **main office** on their first day of return.

Staff will help you to complete a temporary health care plan before letting them come into school. This is for their own safety.

Please bring with you any paperwork that you are given from the A & E department or doctors.








# First Aid in Nursery

If your child hurts themselves inside of school, we give them a medical note to let them know what happened.

A member of the Nursery may call if the injury is above the shoulder or has banged their head. The call is, so we explain what has happened, but your child will most likely stay in Nursery.

By providing fun, hands- on experiences we develop the children's confidence, independence and positive attitudes to learning.


This is done through building effective partnerships with parents, carers, children and teachers enabling us to give the children the best possible start to their school life.






### Nursery communication




In Nursery it is important for us to build the children's confidence.

# Forest Schools- Summer term

#### What is Forest School?

- It involves child-led sessions in a woodland or natural environment, primarily using natural resources.



- It aims to promote resilient, confident, independent and creative learners.

#### Where will Forest School take place?

- Forest School sessions will take place in West Ham Park.
- The school grounds are also being developed to support more outdoor nature activities.

#### What will my child do at Forest School?

- -Children carry out a range of outdoor activities that develop their skills and knowledge relating to the National Curriculum.
- -Some activities may include: mini beast hunts; plant and animal identification; observation of seasonal changes; land art; tree-climbing; digging; whittling; sawing, den building, fire lighting and outdoor cooking.

#### What clothing will my child need to attend Forest School?

-For health and safety reasons, children need to wear weatherappropriate, full length clothing and walking boots or wellies.







Stranger Danger applies online!




