

Instruments

Sitar - The word "sitar" means 3 strings although the instrument has many strings.



Harmonium - Small, table top size organ.



Sarangi - Has a hollow body and is made of wood adorned with ivory inlays. It has forty strings!

Dance

Thumar (or Jhoomar) is a lively form of music and dance mostly performed by the Balochi and people of Southern Punjab Pakistan.

Performed exclusively by men, it is a common feature to see three generations - father, son and grandson - dancing all together at weddings.



The dance is also performed in circle, to the tune of emotional songs.
