Dance HORA

The Great Hora is danced on special occasions such as weddings and is an essential part of celebrations in rural areas.

The dance is usually accompanied by musical instruments such as the cymbalom, accordion, violin, double bass, saxophone, trumpet or the pan pipes. The dance steps are simple: the dancers face the centre, take one step forward, one back, three to the left, and five to the right, so that soon the circle moves counter clockwise.
