Arriving at School - slight change

Gates to the playground will be open at 8:35am but there will be no staff in the playground until 8:45am, so you will need to supervise your children. Children are not permitted to use the playground equipment/climbing frames at this time.

Classroom doors will open at 8.45 am and close at 8.55 am everyday, any children who are late should make their way to the main office with a parent/carer and wait outside until your child/ren can be escorted to their class.

If you want to come to Breakfast Club it is from 7.45 - 8.30am everyday and costs 80p. (Children will not be admitted after 8.30am). Entrance to breakfast club is via the main office.





Collecting your child - slight change

You must collect your children from their classrooms at 3:15pm. Gates will be open from 3:10pm for you to wait in the playground but children won't be dismissed until 3:15pm.

The playground gates will be closed at 3:25pm. After this time, you are late and you will need to collect from the office.

If your child is collected after 3:30pm you may be charged a late fee.

PLEASE PHONE THE OFFICE AS SOON AS YOU KNOW YOU ARE GOING TO BE LATE COLLECTING YOUR CHILD TO AVOID BEING CHARGED.






Collecting your child - safety at the classroom door

After school childcare provision

After school we have a 6 o'clock club. This runs Monday to Friday and is open to anyone.

The cost is £10 per day and children are supervised by members of school staff.

This club is flexible - some children stay all week but others only stay on certain days but this must be booked in advance.

Please speak to a member of the office staff if you would like more information about 6 o'clock club.





After school clubs (Yrs 1-6)

There will be 2 types of clubs after school

- (1) <u>Additional Tutoring/invite</u> these are additional learning support sessions delivered after school for specific children. School staff decide on who needs to attend these & they are free. Starting end of September.
- (2) Extra-curricular activities e.g. cooking, art, sports, gymnastics there will be a charge for some of these activities. Open to all children.

Starting after October Half Term Holiday.

Letters will be coming out in the next couple of weeks about this.





Half-term Holiday club

In the October Half-term holiday we are running a 2 day holiday club at Curwen 10am-3pm.

There may be a small charge for this club to cover the running costs.

Again, letters will be coming out about this in the coming weeks.









Uniform

- <u>Dark Grey or Navy</u> skirt, pinafore dress, tailored trousers, or tailored shorts
- NO leggings, joggers, jeggings or jeans & White, Black or Grey socks/tights
- <u>Navy Blue</u> jumper or cardigan (<u>NO</u> hoodies or branded jumpers or P.E. t-shirts) Curwen logo jumpers, cardigans and fleeces can be bought at the school office
- White shirt (long or short sleeve) or White polo shirt
- Blue Summer Dress
- Hairbands/bobbles Plain <u>blue</u>, <u>black</u> or <u>white</u> not too big

<u>Footwear:</u> Shoes or trainers- <u>NO</u> open-toed sandals or Heelys Wellies can be worn but pupils must change into their shoes when inside the school

Any Hijabs- NO pins: White, Navy or Black

P.E. KIT <u>Curwen Blue P.E. t-shirt</u> -Sold at the school office <u>Black</u> joggers, leggings or shorts Footwear-comfortable trainers

Jewellery - Only stud earrings and a watch Pupils will be asked to remove any unsuitable jewellery or hair dressings. The school cannot be held responsible for the loss or damage of these items as a result of this. NO make-up, nail polish or false nails







Uniform and jewellery

PE Kit (Tuesday)

- Please send your child into school wearing their PE kit and suitable footwear
- At the moment children will not be changing at school
- Name in every item of clothing, including vests

Lost Property

- Please encourage your child to put their jumpers/cardigans in their trays or school bags if they take them off
- All lost property is disposed of at the end of every half term
- Parents/carers are not permitted in the building to look for lost items





<u>Money</u>

We are now a cash free school.

ALL payments should be made online through 'School Money' (including uniform)

Please ensure you receive a receipt and keep for your records.

Please **DO NOT** hand cash or cheques to class teachers.

If you need any help setting this up then please speak to office staff.

Celebration/birthday treats

We request that parents **do not** send in party bags, sweets or treats for their child's birthday as this becomes very difficult for us to manage in school.

To celebrate children's birthdays, we invite them to wear **non-uniform** when it is their birthday. That way staff know it is their birthday and we can make it a special day for them. If their birthday falls on a Saturday, Sunday or in the holidays then they can choose whether to celebrate the Friday before or Monday after.
















- Please ensure your child brings a water bottle (with water!) each day

- The children do now have access to water fountains around the school which are cleaned regularly.






- All medical and dental appointments should be arranged outside of the school day.
- Where this is not possible, please inform us through Studybugs and provide evidence of the appointment.
- If your child is at an appointment in the morning, and you can not get them back to school before 12pm, then they should not come back until 1pm.
- No children will be admitted back into school during the lunch hour 12-1pm.

Medical Conditions

Please ensure that all medical details are up-to-date – if anything changes, please let us know **immediately** by speaking to the **office**.

All children with asthma should have an asthma pump permanently in class (make a note expiry date so you know when to contact your GP). If they require any other prescribed medication, then please bring this to the office ONLY.

DO NOT GIVE ANY MEDICATION OR ASTHMA PUMPS TO CLASS TEACHERS OR SEND IT IN YOUR CHILD'S BAG

Throughout the year we will be contacting parents to update care plans. This is a legal requirement to ensure pupils are safe in school.







Medical Conditions

If your child hurts themselves outside of school and it is necessary for them to wear a cast/bandage/support or have crutches etc, then you must inform us as soon as possible and accompany your child to the **main office** on their first day of return.

- Staff will help you to complete a temporary health care plan before letting them come into school. This is for their own safety.
- Please bring with you any paperwork that you are given from the A & E department or doctors.





Behaviour at Curwen

Children behave very well at Curwen and usually make the right choices. However we firmly believe that no one child's behaviour will ever be allowed to disrupt the learning of the rest of the class.


Children are made aware of the school rules and they are rewarded to follow them through receiving team point tokens, certificates, stickers etc

We use a visual traffic light system to remind children of their behaviour choices and associated consequences.



-2nd reminder. You will need to attend Restart to reflect on your behaviour choices

-1st warning. You need to think carefully about the choices you are making right now

-Well done, you are making the correct choices





Behaviour at Curwen


Restart is an opportunity for a child to take some time away from their class to reflect on their behaviour choices. They are supported by the pastoral team to talk about strategies they can use next time.

You will always be informed of this and every day is a new day.





The trip form that was sent home yesterday needs completely asap and gives permission for your child to attend all of these trips. Reminder slips will be sent home before each trip.









Our children continue to progress through the RML programme at the beginning of Year 1. This teaches them how to 'sound out' words in order to be able to read and write them.



Forest Schools

Where will Forest School take place?











Our curriculum was designed in consultation with Parents and is in now in place from September 2021.



Year 1 Phonics Check

All homework will be put online onto your Child's Google Classroom account each Friday and can be accessed through the school website. There will be a literacy task, a maths task and sometimes a topic project.

This will usually be revision of topics that have been covered in class that week.

Please speak to your child's class teacher if you are having any problems with this.








<u>Reading</u>

- In **Year 1** we expect pupils to be reading for at least 10-15 minutes (4 times per week minimum) to help pupils build on their fluency in reading.
- Children will soon be given a book by their teacher which matches their reading level and they can also select either a fiction or a non-fiction book from the school library.
- Year 1's library day is on a Friday every other week.
- Please ensure books are placed in their book bags every day.
- Reading book changing will take place on different days of the week, so please ensure that your child ALWAYS has these in their book bags.

Top Tips for the Reading Helper

- 1 Try to make reading time fun wherever possible. Aim to do little and often, but not when the reader is tired.
- Make sure that you are using reading material with the right level of difficulty for the reader. Also, check that the content is suitable.
- Blending encourage the reader to break words down into a series of sounds, e.g. c-r-a-sh. Run your finger under each sound in turn to encourage the reader to blend the sounds together.
- d Identify some key letter groups in the story and ask the reader to look out for them. Use the child's reading log to record the new letters / letter groups you are focussing on in each session.
- Encourage the reader to look at any pictures in the reading book to get an idea of what it is about. Discuss the pictures with the reader.
- 6 Make a note in the reading log of any tricky or hard words - particularly high frequency words.
- Help the reader to "work out" words which can't be blended by looking at the other words in the sentence or at the pictures in the book.
- 8 Talk about the book as much as possible:
 - Ask the reader to explain what happened or what may happen.
 - · Ask questions about the story.
- Occasionally read the book or some pages aloud before you ask the reader to read. This will help with understanding and it will give the reader a chance to hear the sounds before reading them. It will also demonstrate what fluent reading sounds like.
- Draw attention to punctuation marks and help the reader to read with feeling, e.g. "HOORAY!" they shouted.
- Play games with the reader. For example, you could:
 - Ask her/him to find a word on the page that rhymes with fish.
 - Try making up nonsense words for the reader to blend, e.g. twoch.
- Use flash cards to practise high frequency words or letters / letter groups and their sounds.
