Curwen's Management Team

Each year group has a Year Group Leader. For year 6 this is Mr Smale.

Each Year Group has an Assistant Head Teacher responsible for the phase. For year 6 this is Miss Horsington.

We also have an Assistant Head Teacher responsible for Safeguarding, Ms Sandhu

We have two Deputy Head Teachers: Mrs Britton and Ms White.

Mrs Mansfield is the Head of School.

Mr Harris is the Executive Head Teacher, and works across the Tapscott Learning Trust.





The school starts at **8.55am** everyday, so you need to be in the playground before then (about 8.50am).

If you want to come to Breakfast Club it is from 7.45 – 8.30am everyday and costs 70p. (Please note, if you arrive after 8.30am, you can't get in!)

School finishes at **3.15pm** everyday, and if you are going to clubs they finish at **4.30pm**. If you are being picked up, the adult needs to be here at those times.

If you are home alone (years 5 or 6 only), you need to get the 'home alone' letter filled out.









- **Dark Grey or Navy** skirt, pinafore dress, tailored trousers, or tailored shorts
- NO leggings, joggers, jeggings or jeans & White, Black or Grey socks/tights
- <u>Navy Blue</u> jumper or cardigan (<u>NO</u> hoodies or branded jumpers or P.E. t-shirts) Curwen logo jumpers, cardigans and fleeces can be bought at the school office
- White shirt (long or short sleeve) or White polo shirt
- Blue Summer Dress
- Hairbands/bobbles Plain <u>blue</u>, <u>black</u> or <u>white</u> not too big

<u>Footwear:</u> Shoes or trainers- <u>NO</u> open-toed sandals or Heelys Wellies can be worn but pupils must change into their shoes when inside the school

Any Hijabs- NO pins: White, Navy or Black

P.E. KIT <u>Curwen Blue P.E. t-shirt</u> -Sold at the school office <u>Black</u> joggers, leggings or shorts Footwear-comfortable trainers

Jewellery - Only stud earrings and a watch Pupils will be asked to remove any unsuitable jewellery or hair dressings. The school cannot be held responsible for the loss or damage of these items as a result of this. NO make-up, nail polish or false nails



Year 6 Expectations

Reading

- In Year 6 we expect pupils to be reading for at least 15-30 minutes each day to help pupils build on their fluency in reading.
- Children are given a book by their literacy teacher which suits their reading level and they can also select a fiction and a non-fiction book from the library.
- Year 6's library day is on a Friday every other week.
- Please ensure books are placed in their book bags every day.
- Reading records should be signed regularly. Pupils should have them every day in their book bags.
- Pupils receive a raffle ticket for each day they read.



At Curwen we believe that you can learn at home as well as at school. This is why we have homework each week and reading records.

Homework goes out on Fridays and is due back on Thursdays. If it isn't completed by then, you will have a chance to complete it on Thursday Lunchtime in 'Homework Detention'. Do we want this to be the case?

There is a 'Homework Club' on Monday nights, where staff can help with homework. There are also homework/revision sessions at lunchtime.

Trip letters

Please make sure you have signed the new trip letter form at the start of the year allowing your child to come to all visits. We may send another letter nearer the time for different trips to remind you of them.

Where possible, we are always pleased when Parents/Carers volunteer to come along and help with supervising groups, so please speak to teachers.

If for any reason you do not want your child to go on a trip, you need to talk to your child's class teacher or AHT for the phase about this. Please do not turn up on the morning of the trip and say your child is not going. This is because the majority of our trips support the learning of the pupils and children will miss out on key aspects of their learning by not going.

Remember to check the school App and weekly newsletters for news and updates about trips and whole school events.





What will these educational visits (trips) cost?

At Curwen we believe our children should be given every opportunity to build on their life experiences. To ensure this happens the school pays for all coaches used and contribute to the cost of all any educational visit over £10.

You will receive a letter summarising the cost of all trips in this academic year.

It is impossible to continue to seen Curwen's pupils on these amazing trips if families do not pay their contributions.





Theatre Trip

Please ensure you keep a receipt for your records.











Report absences through our app...

At the end of the school day, your children have lots to share with you. They may have stickers, they may have learned something really exciting they'd like to tell you about!

And please don't be offended if we don't let your child out until you have finished your call.





When collecting your children welcome with a smile not a mobile phone.

This ensures teachers can quickly and safely hand over children and relay any messages.

Please remember to inform the office as well as the class teacher of any changes in the collection of your child.







Morning drop off

No children are allowed in school before 8:45am. This is because the playground is unsupervised until this time and if they had an accident no one would know or be outside to help them. This means children should not be arriving at 8:30am to play table tennis!

Keep telephone number, address, name/location of school, parents' work address/telephone number private.




Report any information that makes me feel uncomfortable to my parents or my teacher.

6. Never give out internet passwords to anyone (even my best friends) other than parents. (MLE)








In class we have displayed three main rules to stay safe online:

- Tell a trusted adult if you are worried about something














The NCA's CEOP Command (formerly the Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre) works with child protection partners across the UK and overseas to identify the main threats to children

We offer lots of FREE after school clubs for your children which run from 3:15 to 4:25.

We encourage all the children to try and attend at least one club a week.

The behaviour expectations during clubs are the same as the daily expectations at Curwen and can ultimately determine whether a child can continue attending.





Booster clubs

Maths (every Tuesday) and Literacy (every Wednesday)

These clubs start next week. You will receive a letter from your class teacher if you are expected to attend.

NOT optional!!!





Club choices letters will be handed out at the beginning of next week after children have added their voice - this is so that you can have a discussion with them about which clubs they would like to do.

A confirmation letter will be sent home soon after.

Clubs will begin in first week of October.

A common question we are asked is "Can both of my children have a club on the same evening?"
Unfortunately being such a large school with many families, we are unable to accommodate this.

Children's University

- Children should continue to collect stamps/signatures in their new passports (either by: attending some Curwen clubs and by visiting 'learning destinations' around London & further afield)
- When your child reaches 30, 65, 100 or more stamps/signatures (called University hours), they are invited to a graduation presentation. We will inform you when we will be checking passports.
- The purpose is to promote and celebrate additional learning experiences outside of the school day e.g. karate, swimming, ballet, drama, visiting libraries, art galleries or museums etc







Children's University (2)

- Lists of 'Learning Destinations' will be sent out so you with their new passport and then are available from the office & sent out regularly

- The 'E-zine newsletter' is sent out just before every holiday with details of additional activities/events to collect more stamps/signatures

- Passports can be replaced at the office for £3

Medical Conditions

Please ensure that all medical details are up to date – if anything changes, please let us know immediately by speaking to Mrs Welch and Ms Britton.

All children with asthma should have an asthma pump permanently in class (check expiry date regularly). If they no longer require an asthma pump, please put this in writing with a letter from the doctors.

Throughout the year we will be contacting parents to up-date care plans. This is a legal requirement to ensure pupils are safe in school.

What is Place2Be?

Place2Be aims to promote children's mental health and learning by offering a range of services to support individuals and their families.

Place2Talk: a lunchtime drop-in service for all children from Y1 to Y6.

Place2Be One-to-One Counselling: Children are referred for a number of reasons and with parental consent attend weekly counselling sessions for up to a year.

Parent Counselling:

We have a free and confidential adult counselling service



One of the most popular aspects of Place2Be's support in schools is called 'Place2Talk'. It's open to all pupils, and they can make an appointment to spend 15 minutes with a trained counsellor, either by themselves or with a friend. On average, about a third of pupils in Place2Be's schools take advantage of this service every year. Pupils often talk about friendships or any worries they may have.

Unless we hear otherwise from you, the school and Place2Be will assume that your child has parent/carers' permission to come to Place2Talk. However, If would like to find out more, or would prefer that your child does not use this service, please contact Rodney Dee (Place2Be School)
