Curwen's Management Team

Each year group has a Year Group Leader. For Year 2 this is Mrs Richards.

Each year group has an Assistant Head Teacher responsible for the phase. For Year 2 this is Mr Potter.

We also have an Assistant Head Teacher responsible for Safeguarding, Ms Sandhu.

We have two Deputy Head Teachers: Mrs Britton and Ms White.

Mrs Mansfield is the Head of School.

Mr Harris is the Executive Head Teacher, and works across the Tapscott Learning Trust.





Reminder....

The school starts at 8.54am every day, so you need to be in the playground before then (about 8.50am). Second bell goes at 8:57am (late).

If you want to come to Breakfast Club it is from 7.45 - 8.30am everyday and costs 70p. (Please note, if you arrive after 8.30am, you can't get in!) From Year 2, children go into the playground at 8:45am supervised by school staff)

School finishes at 3.15pm everyday, and if you are going to clubs they finish at 4.30pm. Children need to be collected at those times.





After school we have a 6 o'clock club. This runs Monday to Friday and is open to anyone.

The cost is £9 per day and children are supervised by members of school staff.

This club is flexible-some children stay all week but others only stay on certain days but must be booked in advance.

Please see a member of the office staff if you would like more information about 6 o'clock club.





Clubs

We offer lots of FREE after school clubs for your children which run from 3:15 to 4:30.

We encourage all the children to try and attend at least one club a week.

The behaviour expectations during clubs are the same as the daily expectations at Curwen and can ultimately determine whether a child can continue attending.





Club choices letters will be handed out at the beginning of next week after children have added their voice - this is so that you can have a discussion with them about which clubs they would like to do.

A confirmation letter will be sent home soon after.

Clubs will begin in first week of October.

A common question we are asked is "Can both of my children have a club on the same evening?"
Unfortunately being such a large school with many families, we are unable to accommodate this.

Promptly collect your child by 4.30pm!







Children's University

- Children should continue to collect stamps/signatures in their passports (either by: attending some Curwen clubs and by visiting 'learning destinations' around London & further afield)
- When your child reaches 30, 65, 100 or more stamps/signatures (called University hours), they are invited to a graduation presentation. We will inform you when we will be checking passports.
- The purpose is to promote and celebrate additional learning experiences outside of the school day e.g. karate, swimming, ballet, drama, visiting libraries, art galleries or museums etc

Our children continue to progress through the RML programme at the beginning of Year 2. This teaches them how to 'sound out' words in order to be able to read and write them.

Later in the year, children will progress on to the Language and Literacy scheme, where they continue to develop their understanding of the English language and apply their knowledge.

Maths

At Curwen, children are taught using principles from the 'MMS' (Maths Makes Sense) scheme. There is a huge focus on being able to work out calculations using column method.

Parent workshops for both RML and MMS are run yearly - we will share these dates soon.

There is a homework club which will also run if your child requires some support or resources. Please see the club form for details, when your child receives it.






Z Expectations

Reading

- In **Year 2** we expect pupils to be reading for at least 15-20 minutes (4 times per week minimum) to help pupils build on their fluency in reading.
- Children are given a book by their literacy teacher which suits their reading level and they can also select a fiction and a non-fiction book from the library.
- Year 2's library day is on a Monday every other week.
- Please ensure books are placed in their book bags every day.
- Reading records should be signed regularly. Pupils should have them every day in their book bags.
- Pupils receive a raffle ticket for each day they read.

Top Tips for the Reading Helper

- 1 Try to make reading time fun wherever possible. Aim to do little and often, but not when the reader is tired.
- Make sure that you are using reading material with the right level of difficulty for the reader. Also, check that the content is suitable.
- Blending encourage the reader to break words down into a series of sounds, e.g. c-r-a-sh. Run your finger under each sound in turn to encourage the reader to blend the sounds together.
- Identify some key letter groups in the story and ask the reader to look out for them. Use the child's reading log to record the new letters / letter groups you are focussing on in each session.
- 5 Encourage the reader to look at any pictures in the reading book to get an idea of what it is about. Discuss the pictures with the reader.
- Make a note in the reading log of any tricky or hard words - particularly high frequency words.
- Help the reader to "work out" words which can't be blended by looking at the other words in the sentence or at the pictures in the book.
- 8 Talk about the book as much as possible:
 - Ask the reader to explain what happened or what may happen.
 - Ask questions about the story.
- Occasionally read the book or same pages aloud before you ask the reader to read. This will help with understanding and it will give the reader a chance to hear the sounds before reading them. It will also demonstrate what fluent reading sounds like.
- Draw attention to punctuation marks and help the reader to read with feeling, e.g. "HOORAY!" they shouted.
- Play games with the reader. For example, you could:
 - Ask her/him to find a word on the page that rhymes with fish.
 - Try making up nonsense words for the reader to blend, e.g. twoch.
- Use flash cards to practise high frequency words or letters / letter groups and their sounds.

Uniform










Report absences through our app...

- Click X if something makes them feel upset, worried or scared






If you are ever concerned about accessing information online or have any questions about internet safety, you can speak to your class teacher or the ICT co-ordinator (Miss Crosland).

Medical Conditions

Please ensure that all medical details are up to date – if anything changes, please let us know immediately by speaking to Mrs Welch and Ms Britton.

All children with asthma should have an asthma pump permanently in class (check expiry date regularly). If they no longer require an asthma pump, please put this in writing with a letter from the doctors.

Throughout the year we will be contacting parents to up-date care plans. This is a legal requirement to ensure pupils are safe in school.



What is Place2Be?

Place2Be aims to promote children's mental health and learning by offering a range of services to support individuals and their families.

Place2Talk: a lunchtime drop-in service for all children from Y1 to Y6.

Place2Be One-to-One Counselling: Children are referred for a number of reasons and with parental consent attend weekly counselling sessions for up to a year.

Parent Counselling:

We have a free and confidential adult counselling service available to parents on a Friday afternoon.

Parental Consent for Place2Talk

One of the most popular aspects of Place2Be's support in schools is called 'Place2Talk'. It's open to all pupils, and they can make an appointment to spend 15 minutes with a trained counsellor, either by themselves or with a friend. On average, about a third of pupils in Place2Be's schools take advantage of this service every year. Pupils often talk about friendships or any worries they may have.

Unless we hear otherwise from you, the school and Place2Be will assume that your child has parent/carers' permission to come to Place2Talk.
