Where it is spoken

- It is the **official** language of **Philippines**, together with English.
- It is also spoken in many other countries, including **Canada, Guam, Midway Islands, Saudi Arabia, the UAE, UK and USA.**
- Filipino is based on another language, Tagalog.
- Total number of Filipino speakers as first language:
28 million people!



There are 185 different languages spoken in Philippines!

Language of the Month: Filipino Culture

The Philippines, an archipelago of 7,100 islands, is made up of 77 provinces grouped into 16 regions.



Based on religion, the population may be grouped into three categories:

- . Christian groups
- . Indigenous religion groups
- . Muslim groups

Celebrations

Christmas is one of the most loved celebration by Filipinos. Families and relatives gather on the 24th of December, to celebrate food prepared for "**Noche Buena**," a Spanish term which means "midnight meal" to greet Christmas Day.

New Year is another celebration that gathers the Filipino families. **Wearing dotted clothes** and preparing round fruits on the table, which symbolize prosperity, is one of the customs of the Filipinos.

Music

Although, geographically, the Philippines belongs to the East, its music has been heavily influenced by the West thanks to 333 years of Spanish rule and 45 years of American domination.



Music in the hamlets where indigenous culture continues to thrive has strong Asian features.



Spanish and American influences are more evident in the music of the urban areas.
