# Making Carton Bird feeders

1. Cut two rectangular holes in an old carton using scissors - ask an adult to help!

2. Carefully poke a hole under each opening using scissors.

3. Push a stick through the hole to make a perch.



4. Attach a string to the top of the carton to hang it up.

5. Fill up your bird feeder with bird seed, porridge oats, or scraps of bread
