### Speech and Language—Extra Support

This year, our school is buying in extra speech and language therapy from East London NHS Foundation Trust. The speech and language therapist will be in one day a week working in classrooms and with teachers and teaching assistants.

All children may work with her at times. School may ask her to observe your child so that she can provide



school-based recommendations. If you would not like for this to happen, please let the school staff know.

If you have concerns about your child's speech, language or communication, please speak with school staff in the first instance. If there is a need to work one-to -one with your child or to carry out further assessment, you will receive a letter to request your permission. The therapist would then make contact with you either before or after assessment.
