Curwen are relaunching Street Tag. This is an exciting way for families and the School staff to be physically active, by turning their streets into a virtual playground, to increase their outdoor experience in walking, running and cycling more to earn rewards and get fit.

During the Street Tag experience, participants record their distance walked, ran or cycled by scanning virtual tags with their smartphone at various locations, watching their total distance accumulate to climb up on the Schools leaderboard, creating competition, being physically active, connecting with green spaces, rediscovering their local area, and earning prizes. 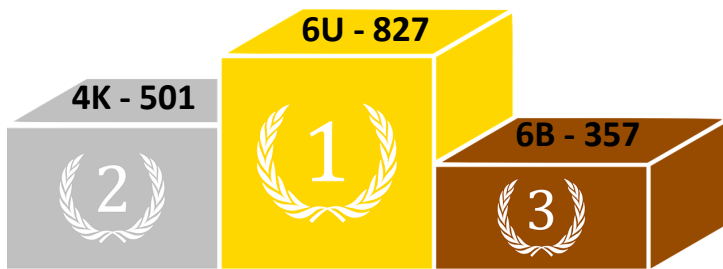
