RE Curriculum

RE in Newham

Religious Education (RE) is part of the curriculum that all schools must provide for pupils 4 - 18. In contrast to other subjects in the curriculum where there are national programmes of study, the programme for RE is agreed by each Local Authority (LA). The document in which each LA sets out the RE programme for its schools is called a 'local agreed syllabus for religious education'. Why is R.E. important?

It is important that your child develops an understanding of the world around them and the different beliefs within it. At Curwen, children form part of a multi-cultural and diverse society. It is important that they have a good understanding of their peers religious beliefs and views, alongside their own as well.

How will the children be learning?

At Curwen, we want children to gain a deeper understanding of RE not just through textbooks, but using the broad range of resources available. This includes:

- Visits to places of worship
- Exploring religious artefacts
- Research on the internet
- External visitors of different faiths
- Children and staff sharing their knowledge
- Class assemblies
- Role play
- Collective worship



How can you help your child?

- Help them to research topics using the internet.
- Go to the local library to use books for research.
- Talk about your own experiences and encourage them to share their thoughts and beliefs in school.
- Ask questions about what they are learning
- Ask them to explain how the topics they are learning relate to their own life.

What will your child be learning...

Reception

RE focuses on religious stories and the celebrations of the main religions. Visit to a local church.

Year 1

What does it mean to belong? Programme of study:

- What does it mean to belong to Hinduism?
- How do Christians celebrate Christmas?
- What does it mean to belong to Sikhism?
- What does it mean to belong to Islam?
- What does it mean to belong to Christianity?
- What is special about living with family & friends?

Year 2

What can we learn from special stories? Programme of study:

- Why are different books special for different people?
- What does it mean to say sorry?
- Why did Jesus tell special stories?
- Why is Easter important to Christian people? -
- How does special foods and fasting help people in their faith?
- Where did the world come from?
 How should we look after it?

Year 3

How are signs and symbols important in religion?

Programme of study:

- What can we learn about special symbols and signs used in special religions?
- How do Jewish people celebrate their beliefs at home and in the Synagogue?
- How did Jesus and Buddha make people think?
- How and why do Hindus people celebrate Holi?
- What do Sikhi sayings tell us about Sikhi beliefs?
- What is the significance of light in religions?

Year 4

What is important to people in my local community?

Programme of study:

- What religions and world views are represented in our neighbourhood?
- How and why do Hindu people worship at home and in the Mandir?
- Why is the Bible a special book?
- Why is Easter important to Christians?
- What makes me the person I am?
- What happens when someone gets married?

Year 5

What impact do beliefs have on actions?

Programme of study:

- What do religions and World views believe about God?
- How is Christmas Celebrated around the World?
- What inner forces affect how we think and behave?
- How do Christian people try and follow Jesus' example?
- Should all creatures be treated equally?
- Why is Muhammad and the Qur'an important for Muslim people?

Year 6

How important are the similarities and differences between and within religions and worldviews?

Programme of study:

- What similarities and differences are there between religions and World views?
- What do people believe about life after death?
- What qualities are important to present-day religious leaders?
- What happened on the first Easter Sunday?
- How do people express their faith through the arts in Christianity?
- How could we design a celebration that involved everyone, whether religious or not?
