WINTER FOREST SCHOOL CLOTHING

PLEASE CHECK WHEN YOUR CHILD'S FOREST SCHOOL SESSION IS AND MAKE SURE THEY ARE DRESSED APPROPRIATELY AND HAVE ANY SPARE CLOTHING THAT THEY NEED TO KEEP WARM AND DRY THROUGHOUT THE DAY.

During the $\mbox{\it winter}$ months, children should come prepared to each session with:

- \cdot woolly hat and scarf
- · gloves
- · waterproof jacket and winter coat or a complete waterproof winter coat
- $\cdot \ \text{fleece/ sweatshirt} \\$
- · wellies/waterproof boots
- · extra layers (e.g. vest, t-shirt, long-sleeved top, sweatshirt/hoody etc.)
- \cdot extra socks (e.g. wear 2 pairs and bring a spare pair to change into if they get wet).

This will ensure that children are comfortable and able to enjoy the session.
