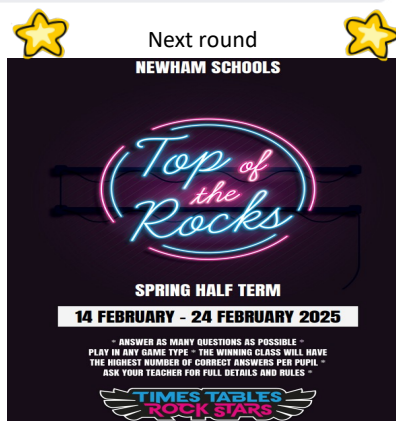
Out of 3,623 schools in the country, Curwen came 983!

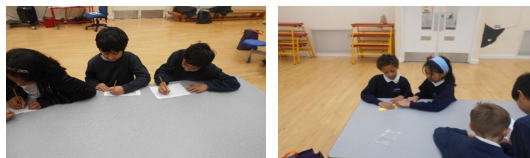
