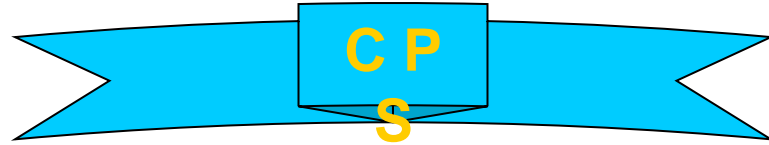

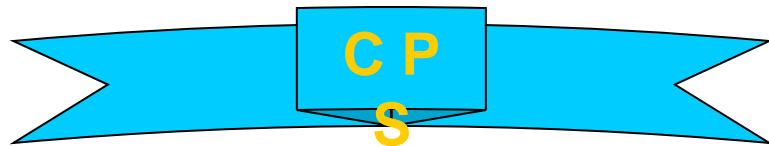

Each year group has a Year Group Leader. For year Nursery this is **Ms. Tome**.

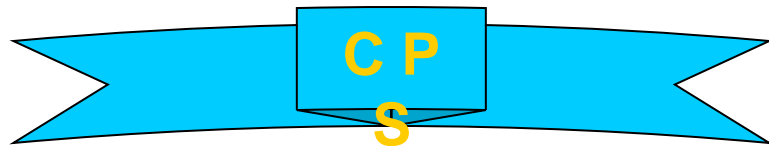
Each Year Group has an Assistant Head Teacher responsible for the phase. For year Nursery this is **Miss. Sawyer**.

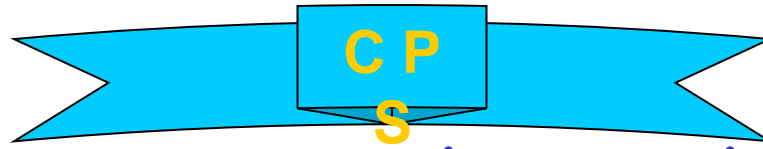

Your child's nursery session- arriving at Nursery

Gates to the playground will be open at 8:35am but there will be no staff in the playground until 8:45am. Children are not permitted to use the playground equipment/climbing frames at this time.

AM: 08:45-09:15- Gates will be locked

Home time: 11:45

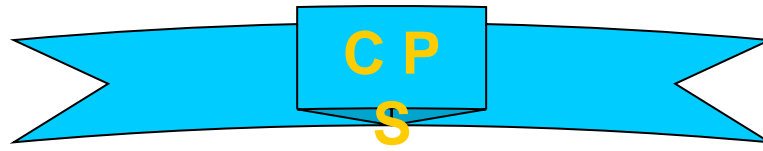
The Nursery gate will be opened at 12:15pm.

PM: 12:15-12:45- Gates will be locked

Home time: 3:15

30hour provision: 08:45-3:15 (limited availability
and have to be eligible)

If you are late arriving at Nursery we will be unable to let you in.



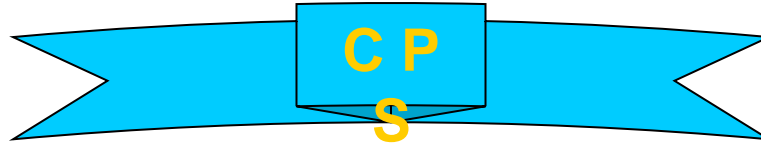
Collecting your child

You must collect your children from Nursery at **11:45am/3:15pm**. Gates will be open from 11:40am/3:10pm for you to wait in the playground but children won't be dismissed until 11:45am/3:15pm.

The playground gates will be closed at **11:55am/3:25pm**. After this time, you are late and you will need to collect from the office.

If your child is collected after 12pm/3:30pm you may be charged a late fee.

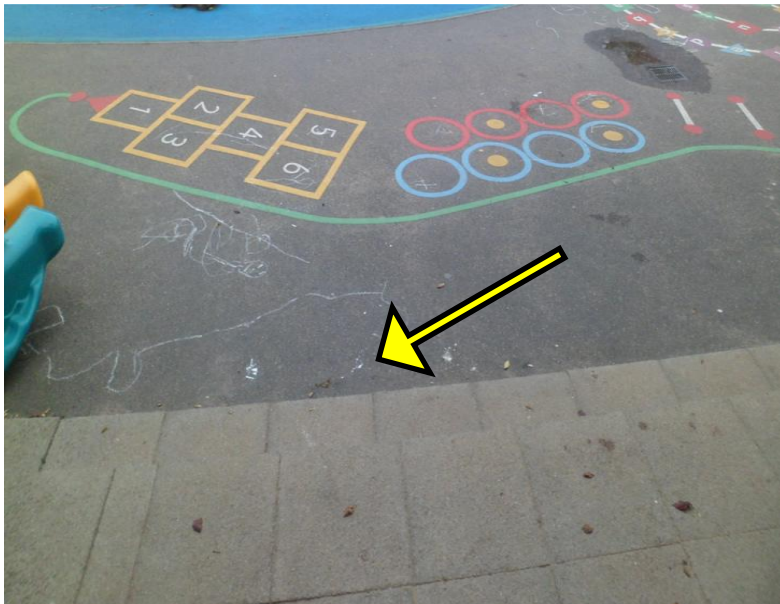

Collecting your child - safety at the classroom door

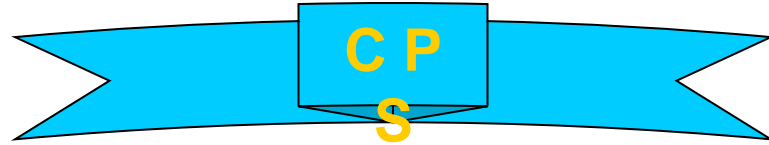
Please be patient with teachers and staff whilst we get to know your faces at the end of the day.

We want to make sure that the children are sent home safely, so please be patient. The teacher may be speaking to a parent, so it may take a minute or 2 to dismiss your child.



Please stand back from the steps to give children space to come out of Nursery.

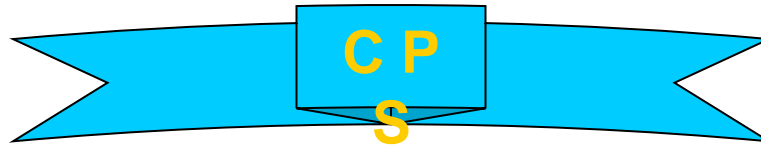


Welcome them with a smile, not a mobile phone.

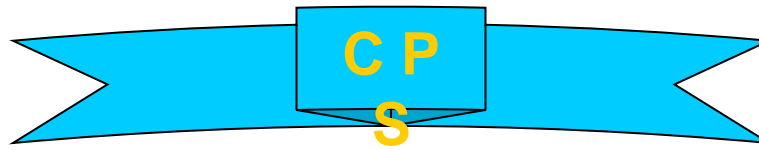
Scooter & bike safety - before/after school

The playground is a very busy place so all children and adults must **COMPLETELY** dismount from scooters and bikes once on school premises. Expect to be spoken to by school staff and if it continues, your child may not be permitted to bring their scooter/bike to school any longer.

Last year there were several collisions/injuries in the playground relating to scooter/bike usage before & after school.

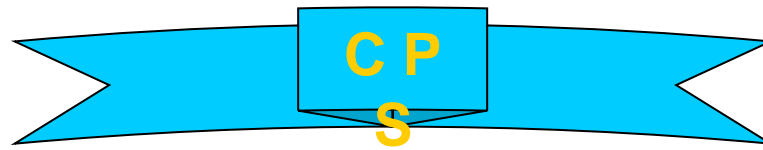


Coming into Nursery...

We welcome parents back into Nursery. Staff will be available to talk to but we will be ensuring we want to settle children safely so if you could wait until the children are safely inside or send a message on studybugs. We encourage you to help your child to recognise and point out their name and photo, put their water bottle in the tray and come into Nursery.



This encourages them to recognise their name and answer the question displayed.

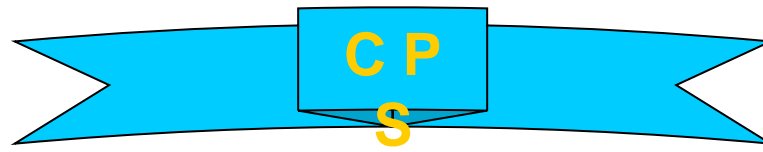


Clothing in Nursery

- Name in **every** item of clothing
- Small, stud earrings only no jewellery
- Appropriate clothing for the children to play and move around in
- Correct size clothing and footwear
- Please ensure shoes fit correctly
- Children must wear underwear
- Weather appropriate clothing
- e.g. layers



Please ensure your child's name is on **EVERYTHING!**



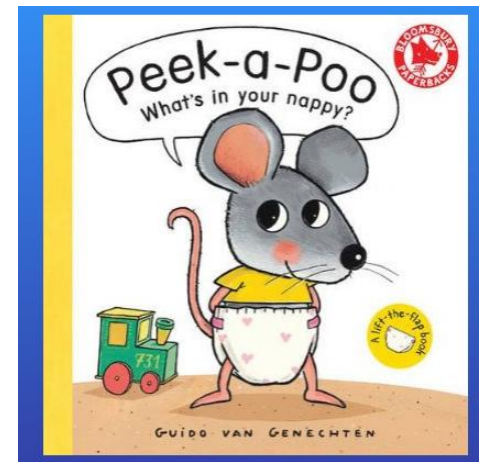
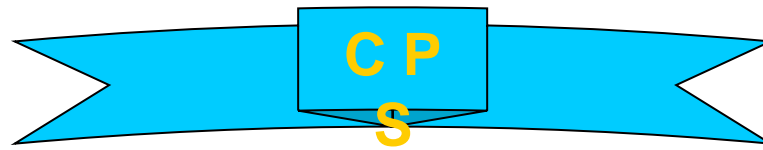
Water bottles

Make sure your child's water bottle is labelled with their name.

We encourage the children to drink throughout the session, but please help us to ensure your child recognises their own water bottle.

Snack table

Milk and fruit is offered in each session.



Please encourage your children to use the toilet independently. We need to work together to achieve this.

We ask for the children NOT to wear nappies/pull ups to Nursery.

Children must wear underwear at all times.

If you need advice or support please ask.



1 Month:

About 4 bowel movements a day associated with waking up.

2 Month:

2 bowel movements a day either at waking up or after being fed.

4 Month:

Some delay shown between feeding and elimination.

7 Month:

Stays dry for 1-2 hour intervals.



1.5 years:

May awaken at night and cry to be changed. Child may indicate wet pants.

Between 2 - 3 years:

Only has an occasional accident. Begins to differentiate between elimination functions.



3 years:

Begins to develop a routine for elimination.

3.5 years:

Attempts to wipe self but not successful.

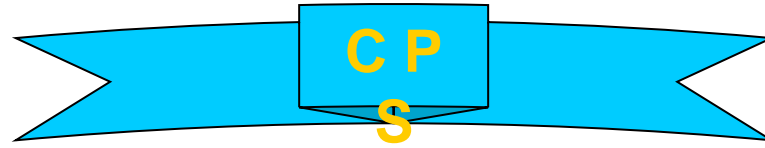
4 years:

Stays dry at night.

5 years:

Can toilet self without assistance. Washes and dries own hands after toileting. One bowel movement a day.

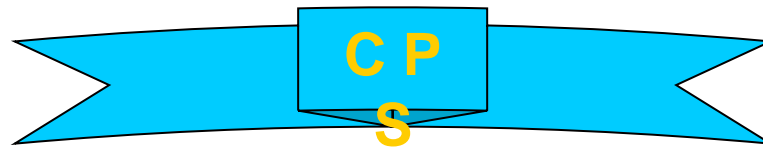




Physical milestones are important.
If your child does not have a medical
condition they should not be using a
buggy/stroller/pushchairs/pram to come to
Nursery.

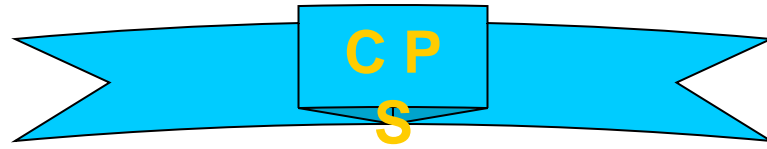
They should walk or use a scooter to come to
Nursery.

It is important for the child's physical and
mental development to walk.



Food

- There is no food allowed in nursery
- Do NOT put extra food or drinks inside the children's bag
- There is a snack table for the children to enjoy milk and fruit
- This is due to allergies within nursery



Money

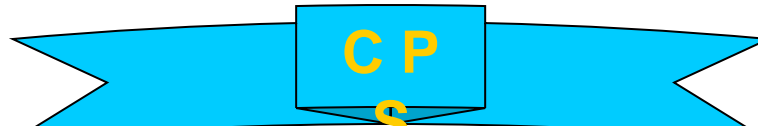
We are still a cash free school.

Please **DO NOT** hand cash to class teachers. On charity collection days, please hand in any cash to staff in the playground holding the blue collection buckets.

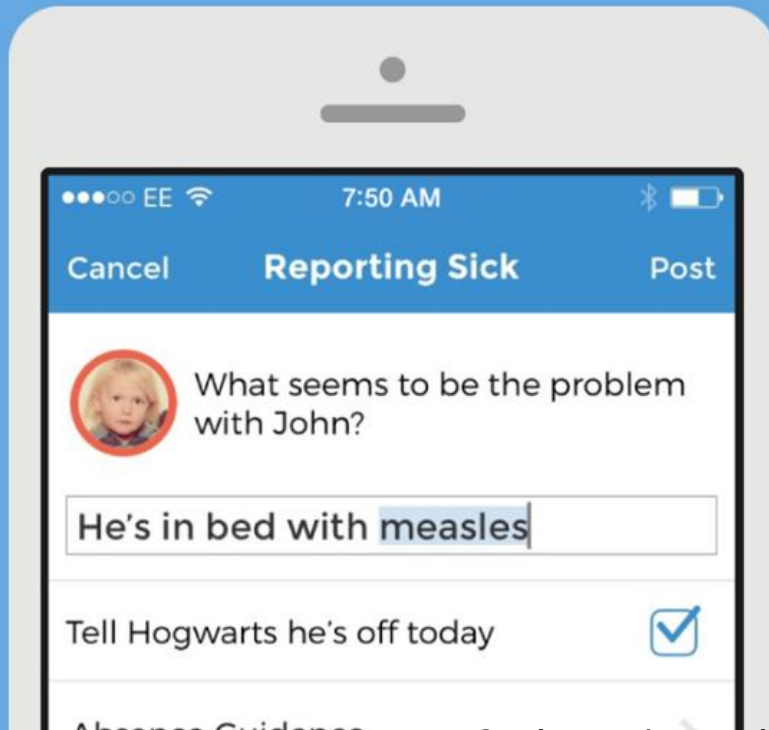

A better, safer way to report when your child is sick and off school.

If your child is reported absent and we have not heard from you our attendance officer will be conducting home visits.

Celebration/birthday treats

We request that parents **do not** send in party bags, sweets or treats for their child's birthday as this becomes very difficult for us to manage in school.

To celebrate children's birthdays, we invite them to wear **non-uniform** when it is their birthday. That way staff know it is their birthday and we can make it a special day for them. If their birthday falls on a Saturday, Sunday or in the holidays then they can choose whether to celebrate the Friday before or Monday after.



Please help us!!

Please remove all keyrings and toys from your children's bags - they go missing and cause LOTS of upset, arguments and distractions.

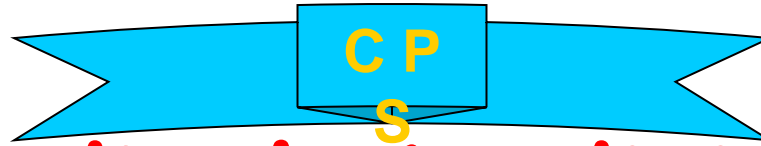
Children should also not bring any toys, football cards etc to school please.





Medical Appointments

- All medical and dental appointments should be arranged outside of your child's nursery session.
- Where this is not possible, please inform us through Studybugs and provide evidence of the appointment.
- Attendance is important in Nursery- it supports the children's learning and independent skills.



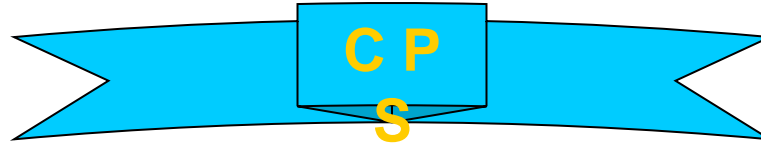
Medical Conditions

Please ensure that all **medical details are up-to-date** - if anything changes, please let us know **immediately** by speaking to the **office**.

All children with asthma should have an **asthma pump permanently in class (make a note expiry date so you know when to contact your GP)**. If they require any other prescribed medication, then please bring this to the office **ONLY**.

DO NOT GIVE ANY MEDICATION OR ASTHMA PUMPS TO CLASS TEACHERS OR SEND IT IN YOUR CHILD'S BAG

Throughout the year we will be contacting parents to update care plans. This is a legal requirement to ensure pupils are safe in school.

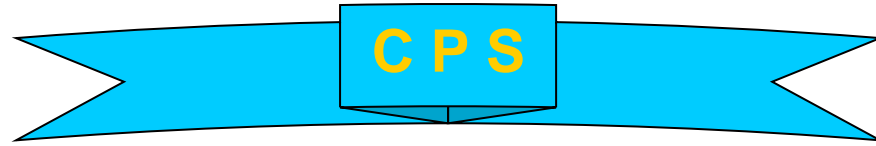


Medical Conditions

If your child hurts themselves outside of school and it is necessary for them to wear a cast/bandage or have crutches etc, then you must inform us as soon as possible and accompany your child to the **main office** on their first day of return.

Staff will help you to complete a temporary health care plan before letting them come into school. This is for their own safety.

Please bring with you any paperwork that you are given from the A & E department or doctors.




First Aid in Nursery

If your child hurts themselves inside of school, we give them a medical note to let them know what happened.

A member of the Nursery may call if the injury is above the shoulder or has banged their head. The call is, so we explain what has happened, but your child will most likely stay in Nursery.

At Curwen, we base our entire curriculum around our aim SHINE.
We make sure that all we do works towards this aim.

By providing fun, hands- on experiences we develop the children's confidence, independence and positive attitudes to learning.

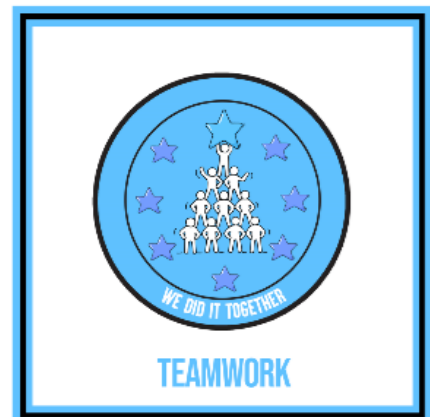

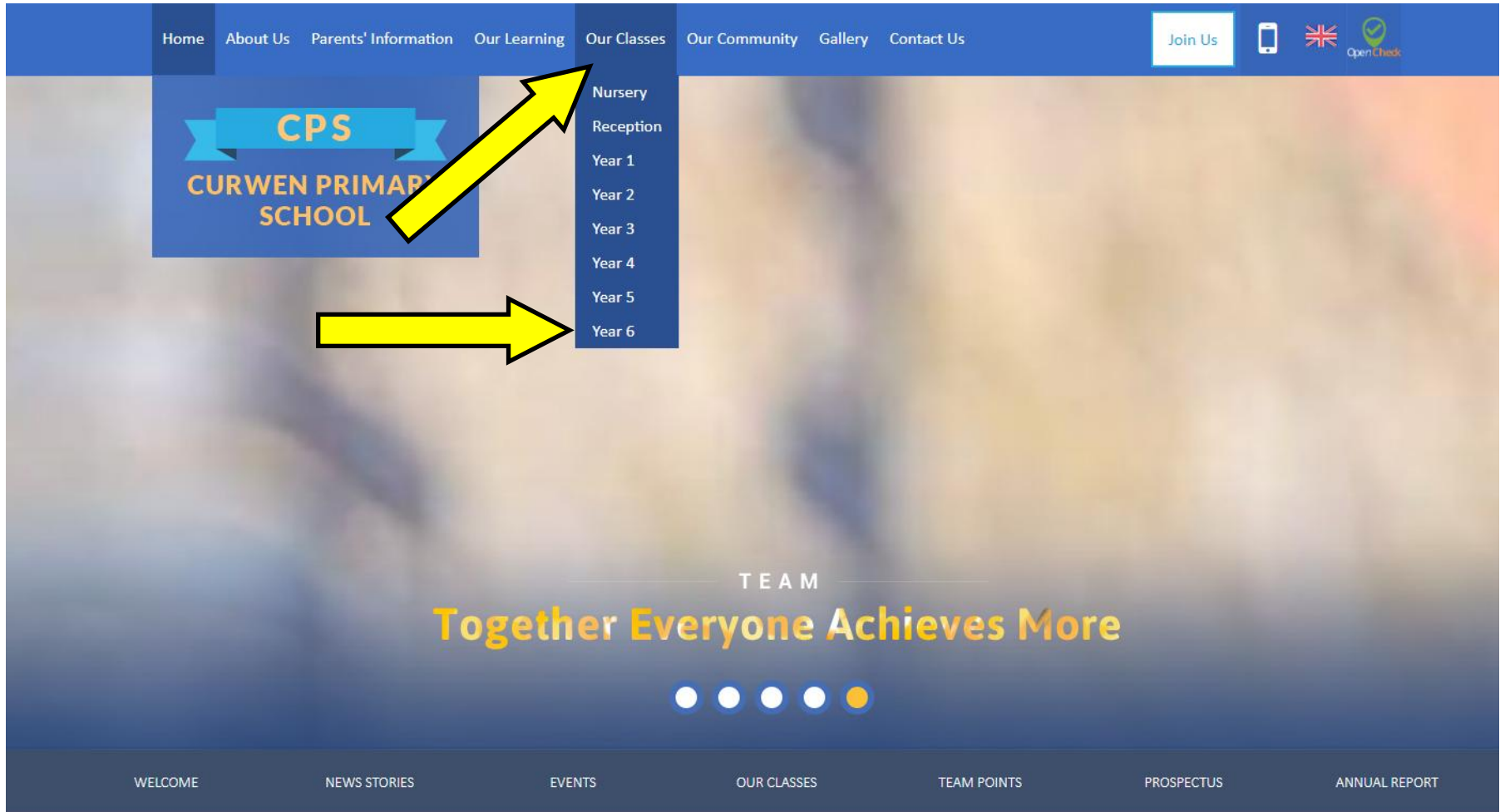
Communication is key...



It is important to remember when talking to children:

1. Stop - Wait 10 seconds and allow time to think
2. Listen - Look and listen
3. Respond - Repeat what they said clearly - Add 1 or 2 words

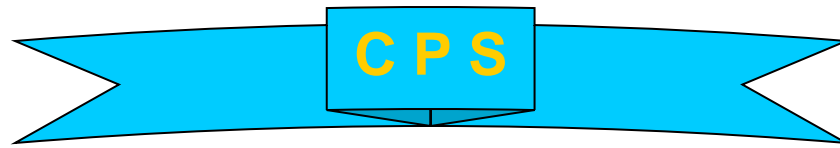

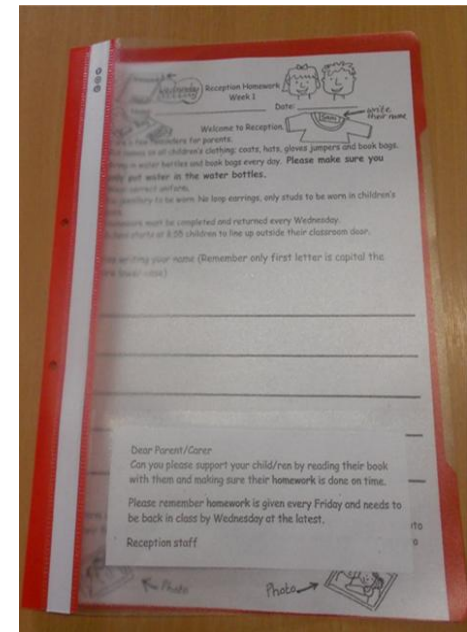

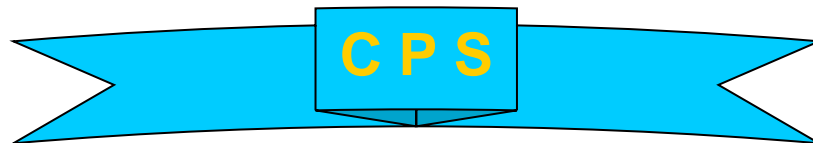
Positive rewards

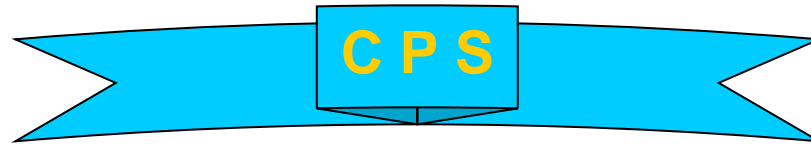

Yes!

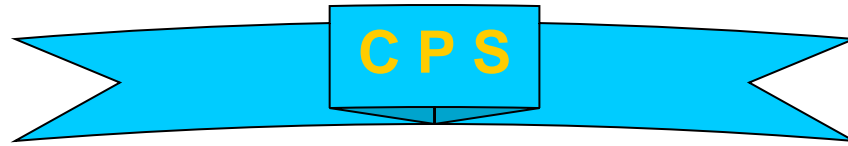
In order to run trips for our Nursery children we need parents to attend so that we have enough adults.

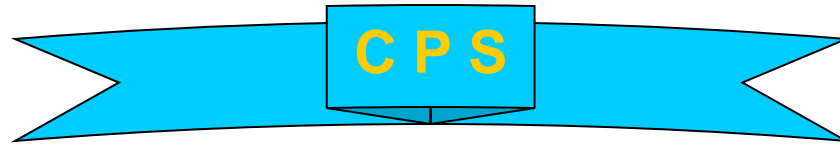

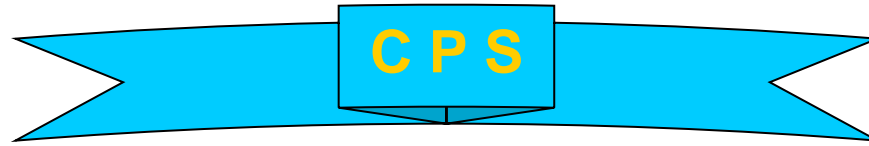

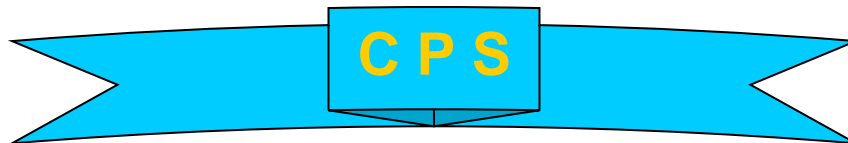


STAYING SAFE ONLINE
