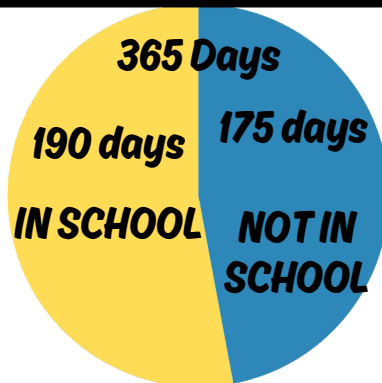

Curwen's 6 O'Clock Club Documentary Project

Curwen's 6 O'Clock Club is producing a documentary about the Wild East End to honor David Attenborough's 100th birthday.

The documentary will feature:

- * Exploring for insects in our Forest School area
- * Writing letters to David Attenborough outlining our plans
- * Discovering new plants in the school playground
- * Interviewing individuals to understand why nature is important to them

During our exploration, we discovered various types of minibeasts inhabiting our Forest School area. An exciting find was that the red tree in the KS1 playground is, in fact, a cherry blossom tree that produces cherries every summer.

One insightful comment from an interviewee highlighted that plants absorb carbon dioxide (CO2) and release oxygen (O2), which is essential for humans to breathe and thrive.

We will compile all our discoveries to create the documentary, and the 6 O'Clock Club plans to submit it to the David Attenborough Team.
