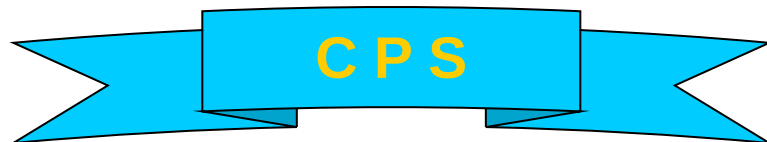

Each year group has a Year Group Leader. For year Reception this is **Ms. Sawyer**.

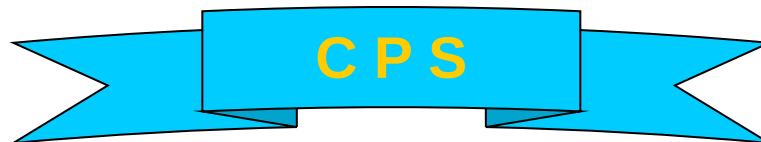

Arriving at School

Gates to the playground will be open at 8:35am but there will be no staff in the playground until 8:45am, so you will need to supervise your children. Children are not permitted to use the playground equipment/climbing frames at this time.

Classroom doors will open at 8.45 am and close at 8.55 am everyday, any children who are late should make their way to the main office with a parent/carer and wait outside until your child/ren can be taken to their class.

If you want to come to Breakfast Club it is from 7.45 - 8.30am everyday and costs £1.20 per day. (Children will not be admitted after 8.30am). Entrance to breakfast club is via the main office. **Available from Monday 21st September.**



Collecting your child

You must collect your children from their classrooms at **3:15pm**. Gates will be open from 3:10pm for you to wait in the playground but children won't be dismissed until 3:15pm.

The playground gates will be closed at **3:25pm**. After this time, you are late and you will need to collect from the office.

If your child is collected after 3:30pm you may be charged a late fee.

PLEASE PHONE THE OFFICE AS SOON AS YOU KNOW YOU ARE GOING TO BE LATE COLLECTING YOUR CHILD TO AVOID BEING CHARGED.



Collecting your child - safety at the classroom door

Please be patient with teachers and staff whilst we get to know your faces at the end of the day.

We want to make sure that the children are sent home safely, so please be patient. The teacher may be speaking to a parent, so it may take a minute or 2 to dismiss your child.



Please stand back from the steps to give children space to come out of the classrooms.

Scooter & bike safety - before/after school

The playground is a very busy place so all children and adults must **COMPLETELY** dismount from scooters and bikes once on school premises. Expect to be spoken to by school staff and if it continues, your child may not be permitted to bring their scooter/bike to school any longer.

Last year there were several collisions/injuries in the playground relating to scooter/bike usage before & after school.

After school childcare provision

After school we have a 6 o'clock club. This runs Monday to Friday and is open to anyone.

The cost is £13 per day and children are supervised by members of school staff.

This club is flexible - some children stay all week but others only stay on certain days but this **must be booked in advance.**

Anyone collecting a child from 6 o'clock club must be 16 years old or over.

Please speak to a member of the office staff if you would like more information about 6 o'clock club.

Uniform

- **Dark Grey or Navy** skirt, pinafore dress, tailored trousers, or tailored shorts
 - **NO** leggings, joggers, jeggings or jeans & **White**, **Black** or **Grey** socks/tights
 - **Navy Blue** jumper or cardigan (**NO** hoodies or branded jumpers or P.E. t-shirts)
- Curwen logo jumpers, cardigans and fleeces can be bought at the school office
- **White** shirt (long or short sleeve) or **White** polo shirt
 - **Blue** Summer Dress
 - **Hairbands/bobbles** - Plain **blue**, **black** or **white not too big**

Footwear: Shoes or trainers- **NO** open-toed sandals or Heelys
Wellies can be worn but pupils must change into their shoes when inside the school

Any Hijabs- NO pins: White, Navy or Black

Black joggers, leggings or shorts **Footwear**-comfortable trainers

Jewellery - **Only** stud earrings and a watch **(no smartwatches)** *Pupils will be asked to remove any unsuitable jewellery or hair dressings. The school cannot be held responsible for the loss or damage of these items as a result of this.* **NO** make-up, nail polish or false nails

 - All lost property is disposed of at the end of every half term
 - All 'unnamed' lost property will be placed in boxes in the glass corridor near our Atlas Road entrance.

Celebration/birthday treats

We request that parents **do not** send in party bags, sweets or treats for their child's birthday as this becomes very difficult for us to manage in school.

To celebrate children's birthdays, we invite them to wear **non-uniform** when it is their birthday. That way staff know it is their birthday and we can make it a special day for them. If their birthday falls on a Saturday, Sunday or in the holidays then they can choose whether to celebrate the Friday before or Monday after.



Please help us!!

Please remove all keyrings and toys from your children's bags - they go missing and cause LOTS of upset, arguments and distractions.

Children should also not bring any toys, football cards etc to school please.





Water bottles

- Please ensure your child brings a water bottle (with water!) each day
- This should be labelled with your child's name and class
- The children have access to water fountains around the school which are cleaned regularly

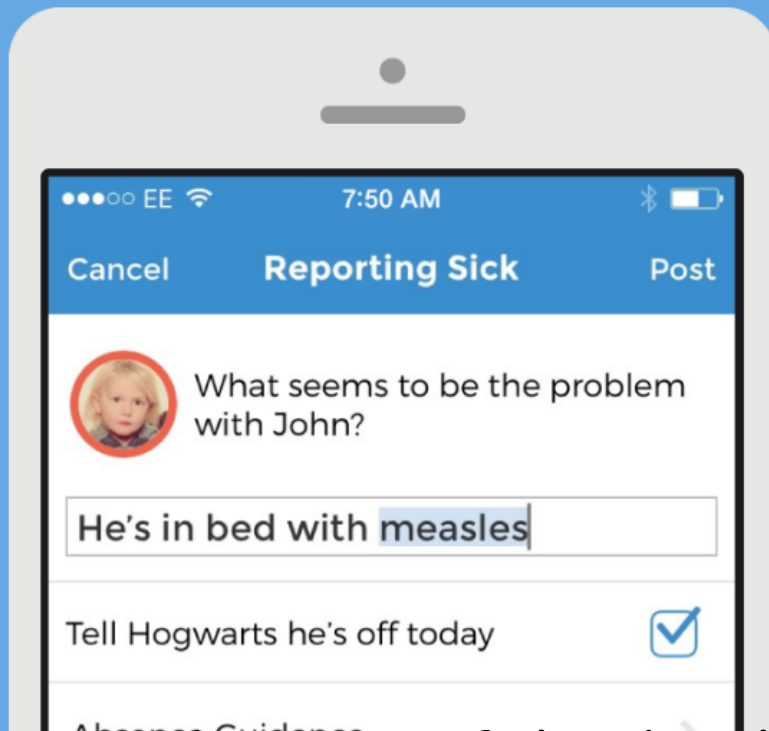


Appointments

- All medical and dental appointments should be arranged **outside of the school day**.
- Where this is not possible, please inform us through Studybugs and provide evidence of the appointment.
- If your child is at an appointment in the morning, and you cannot get them back to school before 12pm, then they should not come back until 1pm.
- No children will be collected or admitted back into school during the lunch hour 12-1pm.
- No children can be collected from the main office after 3:00-3:25pm.

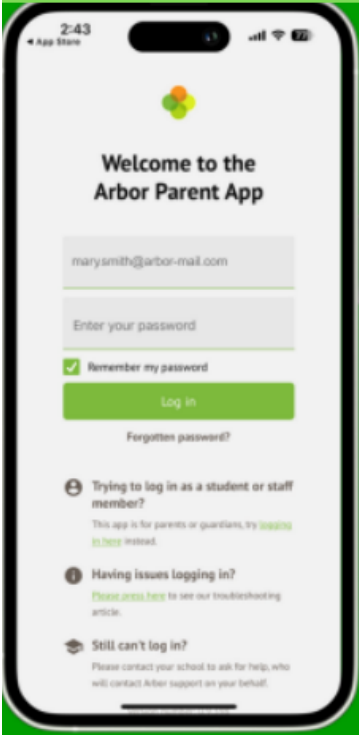

Medical Conditions

Please ensure that all **medical details are up-to-date** - if anything changes, please let us know **immediately** by speaking to the **office**.

All children with asthma should have an **asthma pump permanently in class (make a note expiry date so you know when to contact your GP)**. If they require any other prescribed medication, then please bring this to the office **ONLY**.

DO NOT GIVE ANY MEDICATION OR ASTHMA PUMPS TO CLASS TEACHERS OR SEND IT IN YOUR CHILD'S BAG

Throughout the year we will be contacting parents to update care plans. This is a legal requirement to ensure pupils are safe in school.



Medical Conditions

If your child hurts themselves outside of school and it is necessary for them to wear a cast/bandage or have crutches etc, then you must inform us as soon as possible and accompany your child to the **main office** on their first day of return.

Staff will help you to complete a temporary health care plan before letting them come into school. This is for their own safety.

Please bring with you any paperwork that you are given from the A & E department or doctors.



First Aid in Reception

If your child hurts themselves inside of school, we give them a medical note to let them know what happened.

A member of the Reception may call if the injury is above the shoulder or has banged their head. The call is, so we explain what has happened, but your child will most likely stay in school.

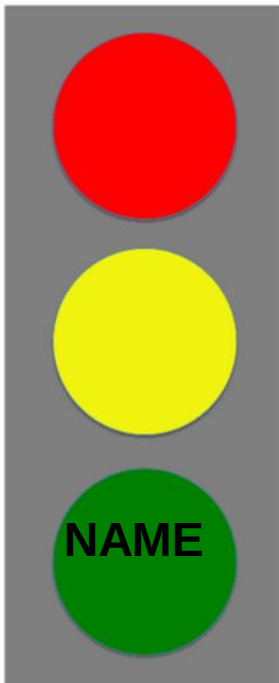

Behaviour at Curwen

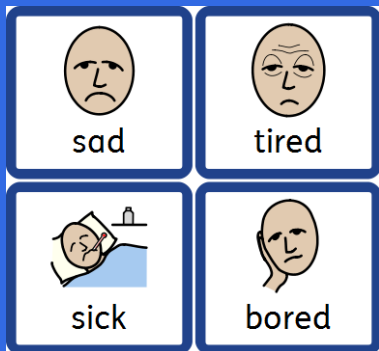

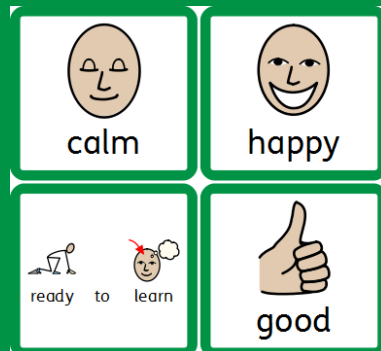


The **ZONES** of Regulation®

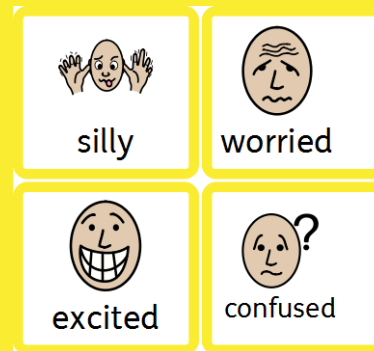
Blue Zone



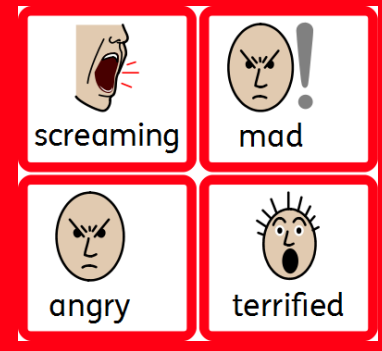
Green Zone

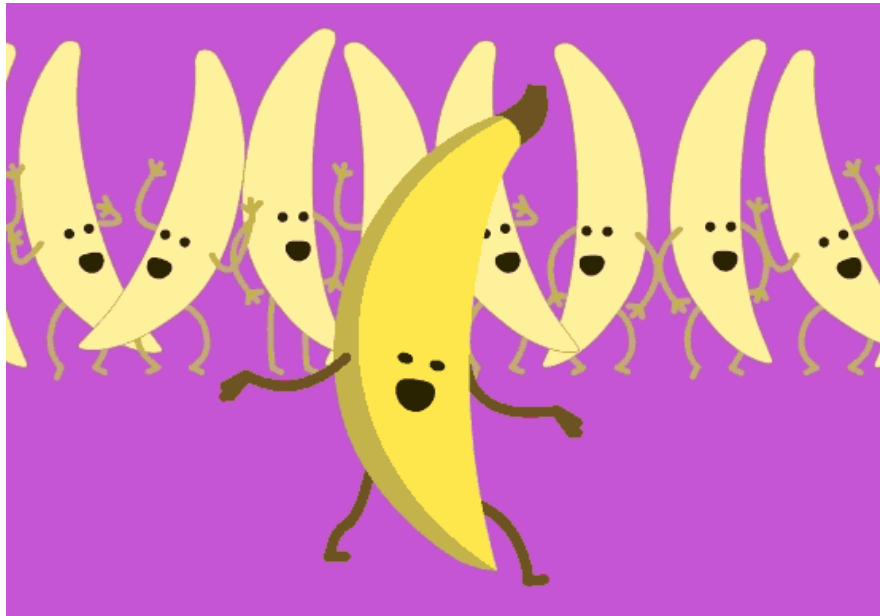

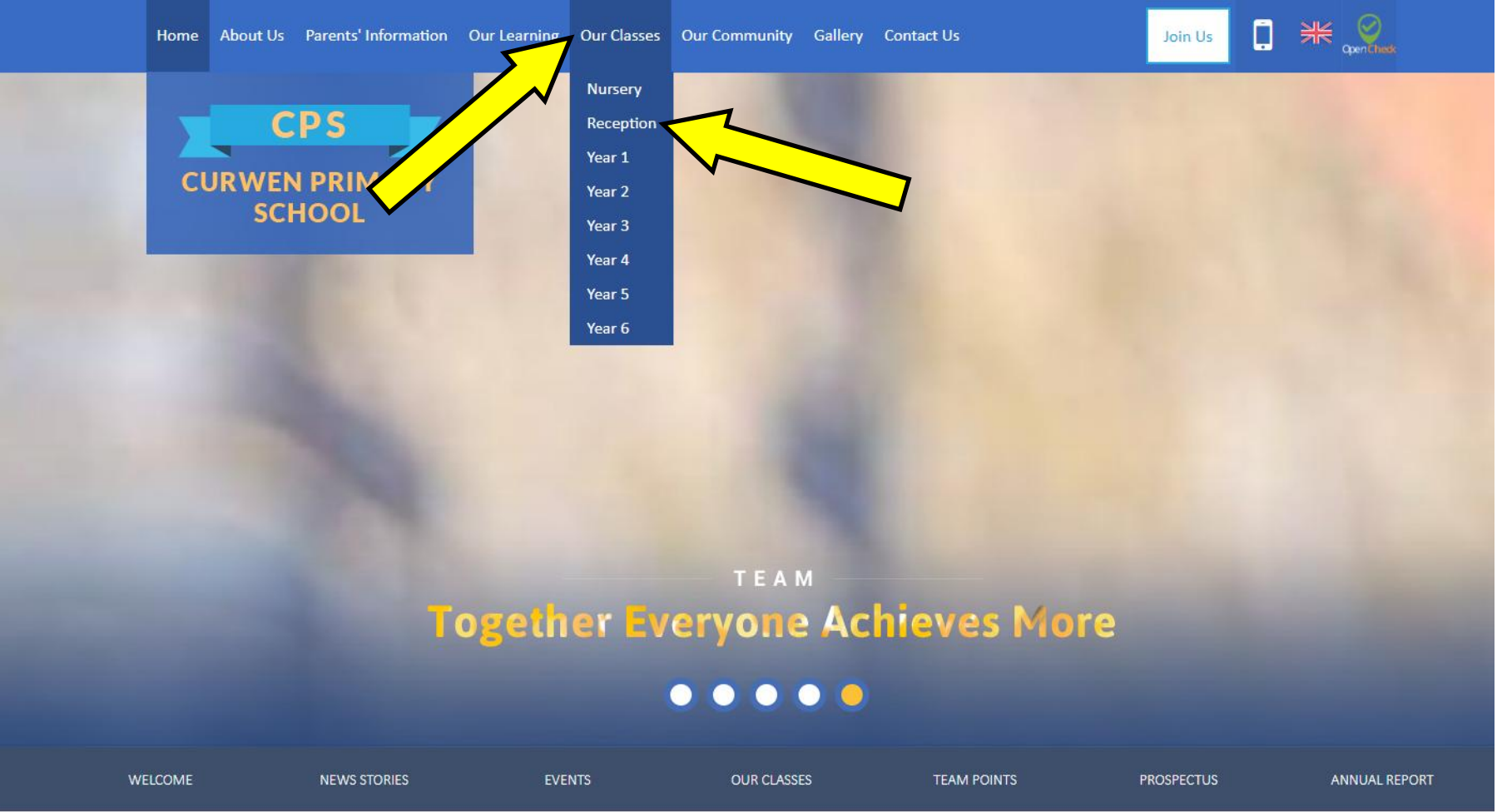

Assessment at Curwen

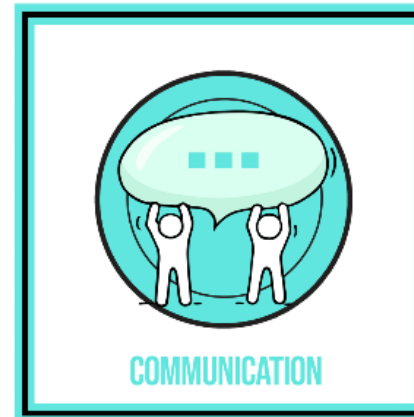
- At Curwen we follow the National Curriculum in Year 1-6. In Reception we have our own Curriculum.
- Each Year Group has 'End of Year expectations'. Reception children are working towards their Early Learning Goals. These are statutory.
- We also complete a statutory Reception baseline assessment (RBA). It measures the progress schools make with their pupils from reception until the end of Key Stage 2 (year 6). It assesses early mathematics, literacy, communication, and language.
- Throughout the year, your child's teacher uses a range of information to determine what your child can do, and what their next steps are.
- We use their classwork, work books, observations, chats with the children & parents to help us work out and share your child's progress with you.

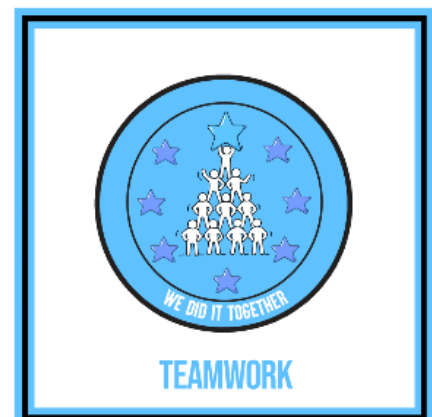
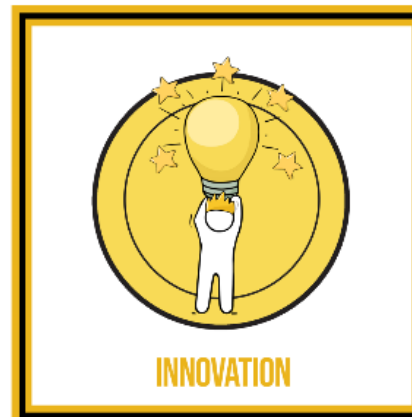

Literacy

Our children in Reception get introduced to their sounds through the 'Read Write Inc' programme. This teaches them their initial sounds and then how 'sound out' words in order to be able to read and write them.

Maths

At Curwen, children follow Curwen's carefully designed maths curriculum which focuses on basic skills, calculations and reasoning. The focus this term will be on 'Number'.

Parent workshops for both Phonics and Maths will be run in the coming months to support you with working with your child at home.



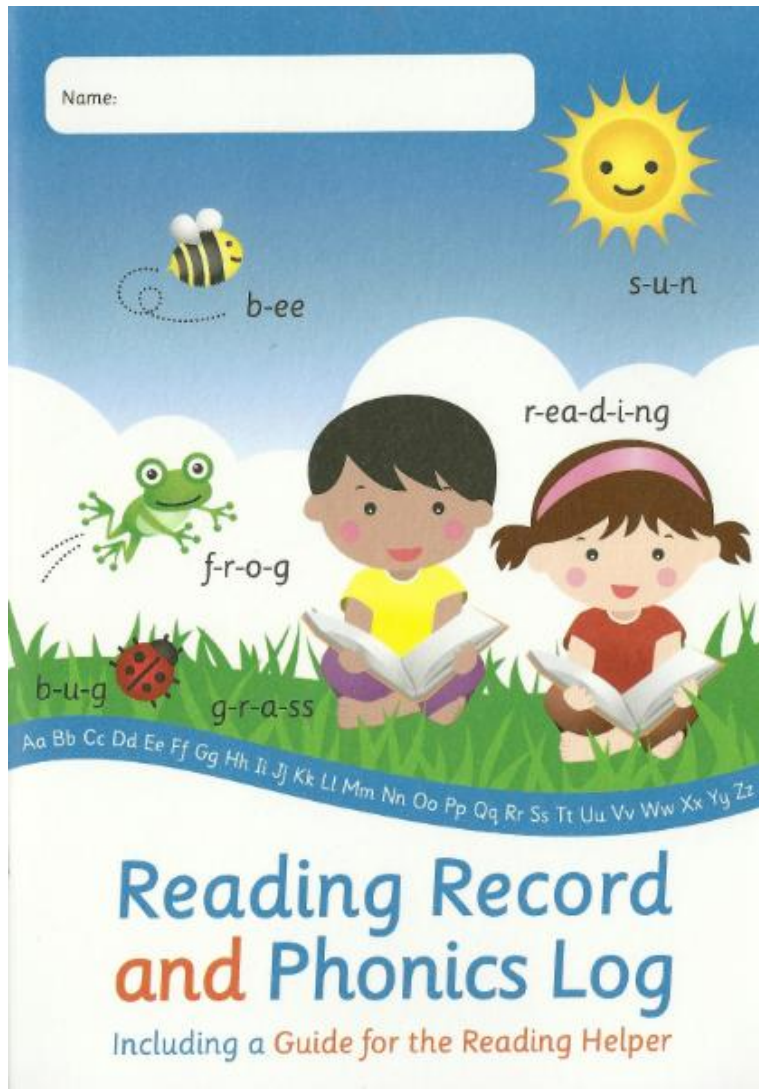
Reading time

Forest Schools

What is Forest School?

- It involves child-led sessions in a woodland or natural environment, primarily using natural resources.
- It aims to promote resilient, confident, independent and creative learners.



Where will Forest School take place?

- Forest School sessions will take place in West Ham Park.
- The school grounds are also being developed to support more outdoor nature activities.



What will my child do at Forest School?

- Children carry out a range of outdoor activities that develop their skills and knowledge relating to the National Curriculum.
- Some activities may include: mini beast hunts; plant and animal identification; observation of seasonal changes; land art; tree-climbing; digging; whittling; sawing, den building, fire lighting and outdoor cooking.



What clothing will my child need to attend Forest School?

- For health and safety reasons, children need to wear weather-appropriate, full length clothing and walking boots or wellies.

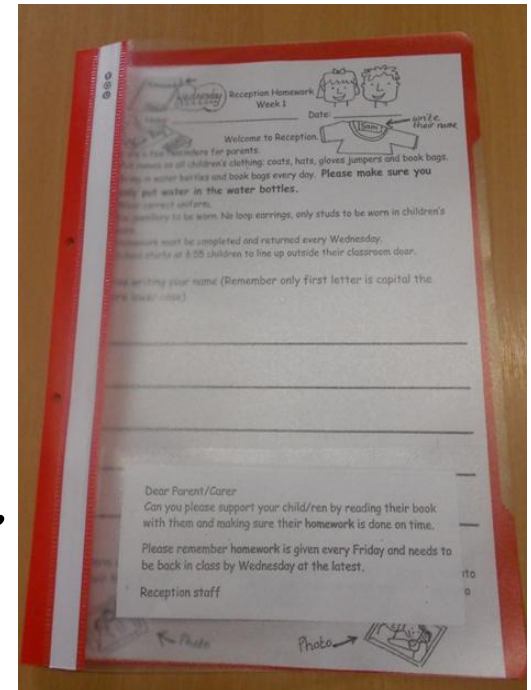

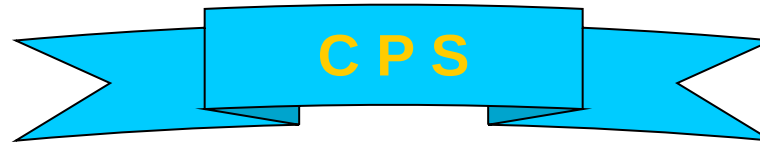




Homework

Can Parents come on the trips?

Yes! But.....

- This is to **HELP** the school staff supervise a group of 5 or 6 children - keeping them safe and asking the children questions to help them learn on the trip.
- Helping on trips can be **hard work** so please only volunteer if you are physically able too & can walk/stand unaided for significant periods of time.
We go out in **ALL** weathers!
- Please only volunteer if you can **DEFINITELY** attend. Pulling out at the last minute really puts us in a difficult position, meaning the trip may have to be cancelled and you won't be asked again.



Can Parents come on the trips? (continued)

- Reminder letters will be sent home a couple of weeks before each trip.
- At this point, if you are able to volunteer then please inform your child's class teacher asap either verbally or send us a message on Studybugs.
- The teachers will then inform you of which volunteers are required.
- If you have not been chosen to volunteer, then **please do not make your own way to the trip venue unless school staff have explicitly said this is okay.**
- Throughout the year we will try to ensure that every parent who wishes to support on a trip, gets the opportunity to help at some point, but you won't go on every trip. Teachers will keep a record of who goes on which trip so that it is fair.

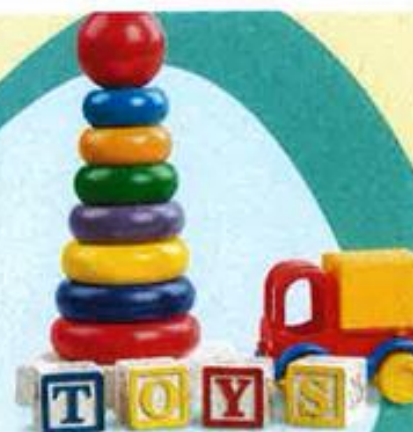
