Outcomes for clubs

At Curwen we provide over 60 clubs for the children, with many that have been split into 3 or 4 groups for one club. Below is a list of what we offer here at Curwen, and the expectation we have for each club. All clubs that we offer from 3:30-4:30pm are free of charge.

Invite only and Open clubs

At Curwen there are two types of clubs that your child will have the opportunity to attend. These are **Invite only** and **Open** clubs. Open clubs are available for all children within the school, providing that the club is open for their year group. Invite only clubs will be for children that are invited to attend certain clubs e.g Gifted and Talent Sports club. Due to the increase and demand of clubs, there will be some that will be on a first come first served basis and a reserves list. You will be notified if your child is on the waiting list for a club they have asked to attend.

Homework club

This club is for those that need the extra time or support with their homework. The club provides children with support in their homework. They will be able to:

- Confidently complete their homework
- Widen their knowledge in a fun way
- Consolidate their learning
- Apply their learning in different contexts

Art Club

Art and Design encourages the children to use their creative side and imagination to create art work using various mediums. This club allows children to express themselves through painting, drawing and craft making. They will:

- Create and design artwork using various mediums
- Improve their social skills with peers who they haven't worked with before.
- Broaden their knowledge on how art can be interpreted

Debate Club

Debate is for children to broaden their horizon on current affairs and agendas that occur in everyday life. The club allows the children to express their opinions on various matters, arguing for and against different agendas. This club will:

- Reasoning and evidence: turning facts and statistics into a strong argument.
- Expression and delivery: being able to speak with the right pace, tone, language and body language to engage an audience and convey your argument.
- Listening and responding: listening critically to the other side's argument, and using what you hear to develop a well-reasoned response.
- Organisation and prioritisation: knowing how to structure your speaking, and when to say the things you want to say

Boys club

Boys club is aimed at boys to help promote good behaviour and decision making in school and outside of school. This club helps them to acknowledge how to work with others and create a social awareness of other's needs. In this club they will be able to:

- Develop their teamwork skills
- Improve their confidence
- Learn how to play with others and share new ideas
- Learn how to make certain foods i.e pizza
- Greater understanding of their role in society
- Understand that it is ok to talk to someone about problems

Girls club

Girls club is aimed at girls to help promote good behaviour and decision making in school and outside of school. This club helps them to acknowledge how to work with others and create a social awareness of other's needs. In this club they will be able to:

Sports Club

Sports club is offered from years 1-6 and in the Summer term Reception will join. The children will have the opportunity to try out various sports such as Football, Basketball, Handball, Tennis, Athletics, Multi skills and many more. As it is important for the children to learn the fundamental basic skills at an early age, this club will develop their fine motor skills and coordination that is essential for everyday life.

Sports club will:

- Develop their skills that can be used in all activities
- Develop their flexibility and coordination
- Have the opportunity to work with others in various environments
- Have the opportunity to compete in competitions and represent the school

Dance Club

Dance club offers a range of styles of Dance for children to learn. This includes Street dance, Contemporary and Modern dance, Hip Hop and many more. Dance allows the children to express themselves through movement and perform what they have learned. The club will enable them to:

- Create and perform their dance to their family, friends and school peers
- Develop their skills as a dancer
- Explore the variations of different style of dances
- Explore and acknowledge everyone's interpretation of Dance.

Gymnastics Club

Gymnastics provides children with confidence, pride and skills that they can use in their everyday lives. Gymnastics helps them to develop and build strength, flexibility and coordination. By the end of this term/year, the children will be able to:

- Confidently perform basic skills in Gymnastics
- Have the chance to compete in competitions within school
- Create sequences that include contrasting actions, shapes and balances



- Create, practice and refine longer, more complex sequences for a performance, including changes in level, direction and speed
- Use a variety of apparatus for both floor, body management and vault exercises

Spanish Club

Spanish club offers the children to learn and communicate in another language. This provides visual, videos, games and information about the culture itself. Spanish is taught within class too which is then developed into the club. Spanish club will:

- Develop the individuals communication skills
- Have a greater understanding of the spoken language
- Acknowledge the culture and traditions of Spain

Cooking Club

Cooking club is a new club that will teach the children how to cook and bake various types of meals. These meals are all halal and Qourn meat will also be used as a healthier option. The children will be able to use different equipment such as a Wok, oven and stove to create lots of delicious meals. Two adults will be present at all times when the children are baking or cooking.

During cooking club they will be able to:

- Use various equipment safely and correctly
- Understand why hygiene is important in the kitchen
- Understand and learn about food from over the world
- Acknowledge and try new food
- Take part in competitions
- Bake various meals and deserts
- Cook various healthy meals, snacks and tasters

Computing Club

Computer club allows the children to explore the software and various apps that can be used on a laptop and an Ipad.

- Design and create a game
- Explore the different software on an Ipad and a laptop
- Use various apps for different subjects
- Exploring google maps

Booster (Maths, Literacy, SATs, RML, Reading)

Booster clubs are offered to all children in preparation for exams that are coming up. They are also offered to develop their reading, writing and maths. RML is offered to the children, especially in KS1, to develop their sounds and word pronunciation. This club will:

- Enhance and develop the children's skills in reading and writing
- Build their confidence in communicating, writing and reading

Lego club

Lego club is designed for children learn to communicate with others, express feelings, modify behavior, develop problem-solving skills, and learn a variety of ways of relating to others. This club will:

- Have an emphasis on verbal and non-verbal communication
- Joint attention and task focus
- Collaborative problem solving
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Film club

Film clubs give children and young people the opportunity to watch, discuss and review films. From this, they will create props that are used within the film such as in Mary Poppins the children will



have made the famous kite. This develops their critical, thinking and making skills. Each term there will be a new film that your child will watch and review within film club. By attending film club your child will:

- Develop their creativity in making props
- Understand the basics of a film, how it was made
- Enhance their knowledge of the genre of films

Science Club

Science club is designed for the children to experiment with new ideas and create projects that will test physics itself. The club will co inside with what they are learning in their science lesson. Your child will:

- Create new experiments and projects
- Have a greater knowledge of nature
- Have a greater knowledge of the universe and the world
- Understand the variations of projects in Science
- Learn about different scientists past and present.

Story Stars

Story stars enables the children to learn more about the books they are reading and focus on what the story entails. The children have a chance to create their own story and use drama as a key point. Your child will:

- Engage in role play activities from scenes from the story
- Re tell the story in their own words

Sewing Club

Sewing is a craft that involves stitching fabrics together either with a needle and thread by hand or with a machine. Although it's a needle craft, it differs from knitting, crocheting, needlepoint, cross stitch, embroidery. Your child will have the opportunity to learn how to sew, sew onto objects and make lots of exciting crocheting. They will:

- Learn how to sew safely
- Learn how to use the sewing machines, crochet and needle and thread
- Make exciting new scarfs, teddy's and much more.

Performing arts

Performing Arts works with Drama and Dance to create a performance using acting and singing. The club tells a story and uses Curwen's props, actors and actresses to perform on stage. Curwen also run a Shakespeare show every year to perform to an audience. This club will:

- Build confidence and communication skills
- Develop empathy and compassion for others
- Self-presentation skills

Drama club

Drama club allows children to express themselves on stage and learn how to communicate effectively with each other. The club allows students to look at different plays that they can act out and perform through their own interpretation. This club works alongside Dance and Performing Arts and hosts performances throughout the year as an outcome. Your child will:

- Improve their confidence
- Develop language and communication skills
- Develop creativity
- Build friendships with other children in the school

Bike club

Family bike club allows children to ride bikes around the school playground along with their family and friends. Children do not have to bring their bike in and can use the bikes that are available in school. By attending bike club your child will be able to:

- Learn how to ride a bike
- Have their bike fixed if need
- Improve their confidence and balance on a bike
- Improve their special awareness of others in the playground
